CITY, BOW

The tower is above the porch on the north-west corner of the church. Access is by stone spiral staircase clockwise in the south east corner. From this staircase there are steps up to the first floor ringing room. The staircase continues past the intermediary chamber to the third floor belfry. The staircase gives access to the top of the tower. The ringing room gives access to the balcony overlooking Cheapside on the north side and the Rector's garden/flat on the south side. There is a sound lantern in the ringing room ceiling.

Rope guides for the treble to the tenth bells. (Boxes - check). A substantial sound control system.

Peal board recording peals rung on the current bells plus replicas of those destroyed in the 2nd World War plus lots of interesting photographs of the war damage and the casting of the present bells. The bells are hung on one level in a metal frame with modern fittings.
