## RULES.

I.—The Association shall be called "The Middlesex County Association and London Diocesan Guild of Change-Ringers." It was formed on June 7th, 1897, by a union of the Middlesex Association and the South and West Middlesex Guild, and these Societies are hereinafter known as the North and East, and South and West Districts of the County Association.

II.—Its objects are (1) the recognition of the true position of Ringers as Church Officials; (2) the due care and use of Church Bells and Belfries; and (3) the cultivation of the art of Change-ringing.

III.—The government of the Association shall be vested in a Committee (hereinafter referred to as the Central Committee) consisting of the following members, of whom five shall form a quorum, viz:—

- (a) The Bishop of the Diocese, who, being a member, shall be ex-Officio Patron of the Association.
- (b) The President, Master, Secretaries and Treasurer of the Association.
- (c) The Vice-Presidents, Masters, Treasurers and Secretaries of each District of the Association.
- (d) Three members elected annually by each District, as hereinafter provided. The President, Master, Secretary and Treasurer of the Association shall retire annually at the Annual General Meeting, but shall be eligible for re-election, provided always that the District Secretaries for the time being may, if thought fit, be at the same time Joint Secretaries of the Association.

IV.—The Association shall consist of Honorary and Ringing Members. Honorary Members shall subscribe not less than 5s. annually, or by a donation of not less than £1 1s. become Life Members. Such Members may be admitted by the Secretaries at any time. Ringing Members shall pay an Annual Subscription of 1s. 6d., and all subscriptions shall become due on January 1st in each year. A Life Subscription of 5s. may, however, be accepted from non-resident Members in lieu of the annual payment of 1s. 6d.

V.—The following expenses shall be paid by the Treasurer of the Association out of the moneys to be remitted to him by the Treasurer of each District, as hereinafter provided, viz:—

- (a) The expenses of the Annual Meeting.
- (b) The fees and expenses of representatives of the Central Council.
- (c) The travelling expenses of the Central Committee.
- (d) The cost of printing the Annual Report.
- (e) Postage, Stationery, and other incidental expenses.

VI.—No person shall be admitted as a Ringing Member if he belongs to a band, till he be certified by the captain of his band to be a change-ringer or desirous of learning change-ringing—or if he does not belong to a band, till he be recommended to the Central Committee by two Ringing Members of the Association; but any person duly certified or recommended as aforesaid, shall be admitted as a Ringing Member at any General or District Meeting of the Association.

VII.—The Annual General Meeting of the Association shall be held on the second or third Saturday after Easter, for the purpose of electing officers, transacting business, and for united practice in change-ringing. At such Meeting a report of proceedings and a statement of accounts shall be presented, and the place of the next Annual General Meeting fixed. All other General Meetings may be arranged by the Central Committee, and the times and places of ensuing District Meetings shall be arranged by the District Secretaries, as empowered by a majority of Members present at the last District Meeting held.

VIII.—That any person wishing to attempt a peal may be proposed, seconded and elected in the tower, provided there be a majority of members present. The conductor of the peal shall be responsible for collecting the subscription of the newly-elected member previously to the attempt being made, and shall at once report the election to the Secretary in whose District the peal is attempted, in order that the same may be ratified at the next District Meeting.

IX.—Members whose subscriptions are more than one year in arrear, shall be deemed to have withdrawn from the Association.

X.—The chief endeavour of the Association being to instil greater reverence for God's House and worship among its members, any member misconducting himself may be dismissed at the discretion of the Central Committee, who shall report the same to the Annual General Meeting, and, in the event of his dismissal, such member shall forfeit any payment which he may have made to the Association.

XI.—That this Association be affiliated to the Central Council of Church Bell Ringers, and loyally abide by the Rules and Decisions thereof.

XII.—No alteration in or addition to these Rules shall be made except at an Annual General or Special Meeting of the Association, and notice of any proposed addition or alteration, or of any motion relating to any other matter in connection with the Association, must be sent in handwriting at least twenty-one days before one of such meetings.

*NOTICE.—The Central Committee will be happy to assist the Clergy in framing Rules for the proper management of their Ringers and Belfries.*

## RULES FOR THE DISTRICT SOCIETIES.

I.—Each District Society shall hold a meeting not later than the second Saturday in February in each year for the election of its Officers and representatives on the Central Committee of the Association, and shall be at liberty to manage its own business, collect its own subscriptions, and publish its separate Balance Sheets.

II.—The District Secretaries shall receive all subscriptions in their Districts, and remit them to the Treasurer. They shall also satisfy themselves, by personal inspection or otherwise, as to the state of Belfries and Bands in their Districts, and make a yearly report for presentation to the Central Committee.

III.—The Treasurer of each District shall remit to the Treasurer of the Association 60 per cent. of the subscriptions received by him from his District Secretary, the remainder of such subscriptions being retained by the District for its own use.

IV.—Each band of Ringers in the Association shall appoint a Local Secretary, who shall collect the subscriptions, and with whom the General Secretaries shall correspond.

V.—There shall be a Committee in each District, consisting of (a) the representatives of the District on the Central Committee of the Association, and (b) one representative from each tower in the District in union with the Association. These Committees shall meet from time to time for the transaction of any business affecting the District not provided for in the foregoing Rules.

VI.—Bands desirous of employing an instructor should apply to one or other of the District Secretaries, who will endeavour, so far as funds permit, to meet their wishes.

### Additions to above Rules, operative in South & West District only.

1. The meeting under rule 1 shall, if possible, be held at different towers in succession.
2. No member shall hold the post of Ringing Master for two consecutive years, unless all efforts to find a successor have failed.
3. Ringers of peals in affiliated Towers situate in the South and West District will pay 3d. to the District Bell Restoration Fund. These moneys must be collected by the conductor of the peal and forwarded to the District Honorary Secretary. Ringers of their first peals are exempt from this rule.

**REPORT, 1934.**

THE 37th Annual Meeting was held at Ealing on Saturday, April 21st. The service at St. Mary's Church was attended by some 80 members, who listened attentively to a homely address given by the Bishop of Willesden.

The President occupied the chair at the business meeting. He was, with the other officers of the Association, re-elected. Central Council business caused an animated discussion, especially the Minor and Doubles question. Mr. J. S. Goldsmith, Editor of the Ringing World, was present to report the meeting, and the Hon. Secretary urged members to support the only ringing paper, without which the work of associations would be extremely difficult.

A strong programme of district meetings was arranged during the year. In the North and East District they were held at Edmonton, Finchley, Northaw, Pinner, Stanmore, Barnet, Enfield and Kilburn. The attendances, which averaged 42, were much the same as in 1933, but a gratifying feature was the record attendance of 38 at Northaw. Considering the difficulties of access to this place, this was very satisfactory.

Joint meetings were held at North Mimms and Waltham Abbey; whilst on October 13th, on the occasion of the consecration of the Church of St. Andrew, Kingsbury, and the opening of the bells, a special meeting took place.

In the South and West District nine meetings were held, with an average attendance of 30, at Heston, Hillingdon (St. Andrew's), Isleworth, Sunbury, Harlington, Ruislip, Staines (St. Mary's) Acton and Twickenham. At Denham and Hillingdon (St. John's), joint meetings with the Oxford Diocesan Guild were arranged, and the latter meeting concluded with an enjoyable social in the Church Hall. Whilst attendances at some meetings are quite satisfactory, it is felt that the proportion of members who habitually attend them is much too small. Many members never attend; we may assure these members that a welcome will be given them if they will support the next meeting of their district, with every opportunity to ring whatever their abilities may be in this respect.

During the year we elected 7 honorary and 57 ringing members, but we have to record the loss of a considerable number by death, resignations, etc. Our total membership stands at 871, a few less than last year.

The band at St. Ann's, Stamford Hill, which was affiliated to the Association for some 25 years, has ceased to exist owing to a dispute with the authorities at that Church. We much regret the end of a well-established band, and that the many years' work so admirably performed by Mr. T. C. Ringrose and his son should have had so little lasting result.

The ringers at St. Andrew's, Enfield, have also felt it incumbent upon them to withdraw their services. We feel sure that this course of action was not taken without due consideration, but at the same time we are sorry that their association with this tower should come to an end. Some of these ringers are continuing their membership, having become attached to the Edmonton band.

To turn to a brighter side, there has been a considerable amount of progress at several towers, and in this respect we should like to pay a tribute to the good work of Mr. E. A. Morris, who is teaching several young ringers at Twickenham; and to congratulate the Chiswick ringers on a fine example of self-help. Given the will, change-ringing may be learned by most ringers, and we hope that the example set by Chiswick will be followed elsewhere.

The peals rung during the year numbered 92, a post-war record. With one exception they were all rung on tower bells, in 30 different towers.

There were 25 conductors, an increase of eight on last year; and 168 members took part in the peals. Seven members rang their first peals, and 104 their first peals in a new method, or on a different number of bells. Six members rang their first peals of Spliced Surprise Major in four methods, five their firsts of Bristol, and one his first peal of Stedman Cinques; whilst no less than 34 members rang a new Surprise method in a peal. These figures denote a decided advance amongst some of our young, progressive members. To mention the many good performances by our lady members would take up considerable space; we must be content to draw attention to the first peal rung by Miss O. L. Ashbrook; the first peal of Cambridge Surprise Major rung by Miss F. Humphrey; the first peal of Stedman Triples rung by Miss L. Wheeler; and the two peals of Spliced Surprise Major in four and five methods rung by Miss K. M. Bradford. Of the 25 conductors already mentioned, Messrs. T. J. Lock and F. G. Baldwin rang their first peals in this capacity.

Amongst the peals themselves are many worthy of special notice. Two methods were rung for the first time, Truro Surprise Major at St. Andrew's, Hillingdon, on May 29th, conducted by Mr. A. R. Pink, and Ealing Surprise Major at Christ Church, Ealing, on December 1st, conducted by Mr. J. A. Trollope. Two name peals were rung, one of Double Norwich Court Bob Major at Twickenham, on February 24th, conducted by Mr. William Pye, and one of Cambridge Surprise Major at St. Botolph's, Bishopsgate, on December 15th, conducted by Mr. Thomas Groombridge, Jnr. Another peal deserving of notice was one of Grandsire Caters rung by a local Sunday Service band at St. John's, Hillingdon, on April 28th, conducted by Mr. F. G. Baldwin.

Amongst the nine peals of Spliced Surprise Major rung during the year were seven conducted by Mr. C. W. Roberts, whilst the remaining two were conducted by Mr. E. C. S. Turner, in each

case from a non-observation bell. The first of these, in four methods, was rung at St. Andrew's, Hillingdon, on April 7th, and the second, in five methods, at St. Mary's, Twickenham, on June 16th. In each case Mr. Turner called his own composition, and he is thus the first ringer to accomplish this, besides being the first ringer to call a peal in five Surprise Major methods from a non-observation bell.

The ringing tour in Australia, which took place in the autumn, was the subject of much publicity in the ringing press. The first peal which many of the tourists rang together was actually rung at St. Giles-in-the-Fields, on April 19th, when the band met in London to discuss plans for their journey. On the voyage to Australia a peal of Bob Major was rung for this Association on handbells, on board the S.S. Barrabool, when in the Arabian Sea, on October 3rd. The composition, now known as the Barrabool peal, was by the Rev. E. Bankes James, and was specially composed on the voyage. Mr. R. Richardson was the conductor.

It is with much satisfaction that we record the re-hanging of the famous peal of bells once at St. Andrew's Church, Wells Street, in the same tower now re-erected at Kingsbury. The work of re-hanging these bells was carried out by Messrs. Mears and Stainbank. They are being regularly rung by a new band which is progressing in change-ringing under the leadership of Mr. W. F. A. Barrett. On the occasion of the re-opening on October 13th a special meeting of the Association was held, and the first touch on the bells was rung by a representative band.

Messrs. Gillett and Johnston have restored the ring of six bells at Bedfont. The bells have been re-tuned, fitted with iron headstocks, and re-hung in ball bearings. Messrs. J. Taylor and Co. have in hand the re-hanging and augmentation of the bells at Harrow Weald.

We understand that a proposal to instal a peal of six bells in the tower of the new Church of St. Jerome, Dawley, is likely to fructify shortly. This Church was dedicated on October 6th by the Bishop of London.

The retirement of Mr. William Pickworth from active work has also caused his retirement from the office of Vice-President of the North and East District, in which he has done so much valuable service since 1924. Mr. Pickworth, who has been a member of the Association since its formation, leaves us with pleasant memories of his kindly nature, and, in his retirement, we wish him and Mrs. Pickworth good health and happiness.

Our near neighbours in the Hertford County Association celebrated the jubilee of that society with a dinner at St. Albans, on November 3rd. Our Hon. Sec., Mr. C. T. Coles, was invited by the President of the Hertford Association to represent this guild at that function, and took occasion to convey greetings and congratulations from our members.

The long illness of Mr. William Pye, who has been Master of this Association since 1910, is causing anxiety. Up to a few weeks ago we had great hopes of his ultimate recovery, but at the

time of writing his condition is serious indeed. His great services to this Association, and to ringing generally, are still needed, and it is our earnest prayer that he may long be spared to carry on his work amongst us.

We are glad to note the return to active service of Mr. C. S. Bird, and also of Mr. F. W. Goodfellow, the energetic Hon. Secretary of the S. & W. District. Mr. Bird was ill for a long time early in the year, whilst Mr. Goodfellow underwent an operation in the autumn which caused his temporary retirement from his ringing work.

The appeal made last year to the Clergy has resulted in several of them becoming honorary members. Might we invite those who have not yet joined us to do so. It is so often the case that a definite connection between the Association and the Clergy results in the greater loyalty of the ringers themselves.

Our sincere thanks are due to our Hon. Secs., for their untiring work. Let us make up our minds to assist them as much as we can. This may best be done by regularly attending meetings and by paying subscriptions promptly.

Postscript:—

The news of the death of Mr. William Pye comes when on the point of going to press. His work for the Association will be reviewed in our next report; we take this opportunity of recording our sincere sympathy with the relatives who mourn him. During the 25 years of his Mastership his aim has been to raise the standard of ringing throughout the Association; it must be our endeavour to carry on his work to the best of our ability.

## In Memoriam.

Members lost to us by death during 1934.

ARTHUR W. CUTMORE.—Died on May 14th, age 73. He was a ringer at St. Mary Abbots, Kensington, and at All Saints', Fulham. During his 11 years' membership he rang 11 peals.

EDWARD P. DEBENHAM, of St. Albans. Died on December 16th, age 76. He was one of the founders of the Hertford County Association, and presided at the jubilee dinner on November 3rd. He was Hon. Sec. of that Association from 1888 to 1904, and four times President, holding that office in the jubilee year. He joined this Association at its formation.

ARTHUR HEAD, of Chelmsford. Died on October 30th, age 55. He joined this Association in 1925, and rang one peal. His death occurred in the belfry at Chelmsford Cathedral, during ringing practice.

WILLIAM B. MANNING, of Walthamstow. Died on June 9th, age 75. He was an original member of this Association, and rang in 19 peals, of which he conducted three, during his long membership. He was a ringer at St. Mary's, Walthamstow, for over 50 years, with the exception of a few years spent at Royston, Herts.

FREDERICK PRATT, of Hendon. Died on January 13th, age 75. He was a ringer at Hendon for 55 years, and a member of this Association since its formation. He rang in three Association peals.

ALFRED G. RIVERS, of Dry Drayton, Cambs. Died on February 21st, age 63, after a long illness. He joined this Association in 1925, and rang one peal with us.

FRANCIS W. H. SERGISON, of Alperton. Died on May 23rd, age 48, after eight months' painful illness. He was Hon. Sec. of the St. Clement's Youths, and a member of this Association for ten years.

MARGARET E. THOMAS, of Edmonton. Died on April 15th. She was the wife of that well-known member, Mr. John Thomas, and had been a member herself since 1919. She rang one Association peal, on handbells.

CHRISTOPHER VICKERS, of Norwood Green. Died on November 5th, as the result of a motor accident. He was only 26 years of age and had been a member since 1932.

## CENTRAL COUNCIL NEWS.

**T**HE 42nd Annual Meeting of the Council was held at Warwick on Whit-Tuesday. All four representatives of this Association were present, as well as Mr. J. A. Trollope, one of our Vice-Presidents, who is an Honorary Member of the Council.

The morning session of the Council was taken up with the usual routine business and the reports of the many sub-committees. The Standing Committee's report included a recommendation that Mr. E. C. S. Turner should be elected an Honorary Member of the Council, which was agreed to. Later on during the meeting, Mr. Turner was elected to serve on the Methods Committee, and his many abilities will be useful to the Committee in preparing the collection of Surprise Methods.

The Standing Committee also reported that the collection of Triples Methods had been received from the Methods Committee, and would be placed in the hands of the printer as early as possible.

During the afternoon session the following resolutions were adopted. First,

"That, notwithstanding any definition to the contrary, peals "in any recognised Minor method or methods containing compositions in what is known as the "Bankes James Arrangement" are, in the opinion of this Council, permissible."

The following rider was added:—

"That the "Bankes James Arrangement" be defined as in the "C.C. publication "The Collection of Doubles and Minor Methods," "on pages 120 to 132, with the exception of the compositions on "page 127, numbered 149, 150 and 151, which are known as "the "Law James Arrangement of London"."

Second,

"That this Council views with concern the comparatively "small number of ringers ringing their first peals, and suggests "that all ringers, mindful of their high calling, should do all in "their power to encourage their less proficient brethren."

Greetings were sent to Australian and Tasmanian ringers through the medium of the touring party. Associations were requested to send photographs of well-known Churches as gifts to the ringers at Melbourne and Hobart. This Association sent photographs of Edmonton, St. Giles-in-the-Fields and Twickenham Churches.
