SOUTH MIMMS

In the 14th century tower at the west end of the church the bells are hung on one level in a low sided timber frame installed in the 19th century. The bells have cast iron headstocks (best to check this statement) and are hung on ball bearings.

The bells are rung in full circle.

The canons remain on the Sanctus bell, it is hung dead and chimed from the vestry. PN: No details or mention of the Sanctus bell in History or Inscriptions section.

There are Westminster chimes for the clock.
