Oblong brick west tower of 1710 crowned by five battlements on the west and east, and only four on the north and south. Pevsner *Buildings of England; Middlesex* p. 136-7.

Small brick tower. Bells are rung from the back of the gallery. Ringing world June 29 1944 p. 261.

The augmentation to six bells after restoration of the tower. Ringing world August 3 1979, p. 657.

The only tower in England to boast of two external staircases. Tower built 1710. The old church had a turret. The church was destroyed by floods in the winter of 1605/6. Carol Sweetland *Journal of the West Middlesex Family History Society* vol. 10 (1992) p. 12-13.

Article on dedication of new treble with some history. Ringing world May 9 1980 p. 396.

The next date of interest is 1877, when the single bell in the tower, which had sufficed so far, was taken down and sold, and the present peal of five bells was introduced, the total cost being £339 16s. 8d. Sixty years later, in 1937, the bells were re-tuned and rehung at a further cost of £139, provided by a private donor. *Church guide*

From the tower: The Ring of Five was tuned, the frame strengthened, and the bells rehung with new fittings by Messrs, Gillett & Johnston Ltd. The Bells were rededicated on 14th February 1937.
