Church built 1830-31 replacing an earlier one of red brick construction with a tower containing a ring of six bells. The tenor of the old six was reputed to weigh about one ton and the bells were rung from the ground floor. *Ringing world* May 12th 1967 p. 318.

Originally there were six bells, recast in Charles II's reign; on the demolition of the old church in 1831 these were sold. In the pinnacle cupola there formerly hung a 'ting-tang' rung for 15 minutes before services which was originally hung in the branch of a tree by the porch. H B Walters *Manuscript*
