[The old church] stood until 1788, when an Act of Parliament was obtained to erect an entirely new church, and the present building was begun. In 1734... there were five bells. Some time later a treble was added, and in 1791 the lot were recast and made into a ring of eight by Thomas Mears of Whitechapel. Trollope manuscript vol. 6 p. 1139.

One of the old bells had the inscription:
O PRESUL PIE NICOLAE NOBIS MISERERE
It was cast by William Dawe, a fourteenth century bellfounder. *Ibid.* p. 1140
