## RULES.

I.—The Association shall be called "The Middlesex County Association and London Diocesan Guild of Change-Ringers." It was formed on June 7th, 1897, by a union of the Middlesex Association and the South and West Middlesex Guild, and these Societies are hereinafter known as the North and East, and South and West Districts of the County Association.

II.—Its objects are (1) the recognition of the true position of Ringers as Church Officials; (2) the due care and use of Church Bells and Belfries; and (3) the cultivation of the art of Change-Ringing.

III.—The government of the Association shall be vested in a Committee (hereinafter referred to as the Central Committee) consisting of the following members, of whom five shall form a quorum, viz:—

- (a) The Bishop of the Diocese, who, being a member, shall be ex-Officio Patron of the Association.
- (b) The President, Master, Secretaries and Treasurer of the Association.
- (c) The Vice-Presidents, Masters, Treasurers and Secretaries of each District of the Association.
- (d) Three members elected annually by each District, as hereinafter provided. The President, Master, Secretary and Treasurer of the Association shall retire annually at the Annual General Meeting, but shall be eligible for re-election, provided always that the District Secretaries for the time being may, if thought fit, be at the same time Joint Secretaries of the Association.

IV.—The Association shall consist of Honorary and Ringing Members. Honorary Members shall subscribe not less than 5s. annually, or by a donation of not less than £1 1s. become Life Members. Such Members may be admitted by the Secretaries at any time. Ringing Members shall pay an Annual Subscription of 1s. 6d., and all subscriptions shall become due on January 1st in each year. A Life Subscription of 5s. may, however, be accepted from non-resident Members in lieu of the annual payment of 1s. 6d.

V.—The following expenses shall be paid by the Treasurer of the Association out of the moneys to be remitted to him by the Treasurer of each District, as hereinafter provided, viz:—

- (a) The expenses of the Annual Meeting.
- (b) The fees and expenses of representatives of the Central Council.
- (c) The travelling expenses of the Central Committee.
- (d) The cost of printing the Annual Report.
- (e) Postage, Stationery, and other incidental expenses.

VI.—No person shall be admitted as a Ringing Member if he belongs to a band, till he be certified by the captain of his band to be a change-ringer or desirous of learning change-ringing—or if he does not belong to a band, till he be recommended to the Central Committee by two Ringing Members of the Association; but any person duly certified or recommended as aforesaid, shall be admitted as a Ringing Member at any General or District Meeting of the Association.

VII.—The Annual General Meeting of the Association shall be held on the second or third Saturday after Easter, for the purpose of electing officers, transacting business, and for united practice in change-ringing. At such Meeting a report of proceedings and a statement of accounts shall be presented, and the place of the next Annual General Meeting fixed. All other General Meetings may be arranged by the Central Committee, and the times and places of ensuing District Meetings shall be arranged by the District Secretaries, as empowered by a majority of Members present at the last District Meeting held.

VIII.—That any person wishing to attempt a peal may be proposed, seconded and elected in the tower, provided there be a majority of members present. The conductor of the peal shall be responsible for collecting the subscription of the newly-elected member previously to the attempt being made, and shall at once report the election to the Secretary in whose District the peal is attempted, in order that the same may be ratified at the next District Meeting.

IX.—Members whose subscriptions are more than one year in arrear, shall be deemed to have withdrawn from the Association.

X.—The chief endeavour of the Association being to instil greater reverence for God's House and worship among its members, any member misconducting himself may be dismissed at the discretion of the Central Committee, who shall report the same to the Annual General Meeting, and, in the event of his dismissal, such member shall forfeit any payment which he may have made to the Association.

XI.—That this Association be affiliated to the Central Council of Church Bell Ringers, and loyally abide by the Rules and Decisions thereof.

XII.—No alteration in or addition to these Rules shall be made except at an Annual General or Special Meeting of the Association, and notice of any proposed addition or alteration, or of any motion relating to any other matter in connection with the Association, must be sent in handwriting at least twenty-one days before one of such meetings.

*NOTICE.—The Central Committee will be happy to assist the Clergy in framing Rules for the proper management of their Ringers and Belfries.*

## RULES FOR THE DISTRICT SOCIETIES.

I.—Each District Society shall hold a meeting not later than the second Saturday in February in each year for the election of its Officers and representatives on the Central Committee of the Association, and shall be at liberty to manage its own business, collect its own subscriptions, and publish its separate Balance Sheets.

II.—The District Secretaries shall receive all subscriptions in their Districts, and remit them to the Treasurer. They shall also satisfy themselves, by personal inspection or otherwise, as to the state of Belfries and Bands in their Districts, and make a yearly report for presentation to the Central Committee.

III.—The Treasurer of each District shall remit to the Treasurer of the Association 60 per cent. of the subscriptions received by him from his District Secretary, the remainder of such subscriptions being retained by the District for its own use.

IV.—Each band of Ringers in the Association shall appoint a Local Secretary, who shall collect the subscriptions, and with whom the General Secretaries shall correspond.

V.—There shall be a Committee in each District, consisting of (a) the representatives of the District on the Central Committee of the Association, and (b) one representative from each tower in the District in union with the Association. These Committees shall meet from time to time for the transaction of any business affecting the District not provided for in the foregoing Rules.

VI.—Bands desirous of employing an instructor should apply to one or other of the District Secretaries, who will endeavour, so far as funds permit, to meet their wishes.

### IMPORTANT.

Ringers of peals in affiliated Towers situate in the South and West District will pay 3d. to the District Bell Restoration Fund. These moneys must be collected by the conductor of the peal and forwarded to the District Honorary Secretary. Ringers of their first peals are exempt from this payment.

New certificates of membership, 6d. each (post free) may be had of either of the Hon. Secs.

The peal books and a complete set of "The Bell News," bound, the property of the Association, are placed in the belfry at St. Giles-in-the-Fields. Access to these books may be had by applying to Mr. R. E. G. Geare, 3 Powis Buildings, Macklin St., W.C.2.

NOT for many years have our bells been the means of giving voice to the feelings of the nation on such a number of occasions as during last year. In January, when His late Majesty King George V passed away, our bells rang out their muffled notes to give effect to the nation's sorrows. Shortly afterwards the Accession of the new King was celebrated by the joyous pealing of the bells; and later in the year, when his successor, King George VI, came to the throne, our bells once again rang out to acclaim a new sovereign. The forthcoming Coronation will provide another opportunity for ringers to celebrate a great national event, and in this we must all do our share.

The memorial to the late William Pye was completed early in the year. The two memorial bells at St. John's Church, Leytonstone, were dedicated by the Bishop of Barking on May 30th, in the presence of a large and representative congregation. The inscriptions on the bells are as follows:—

Treble: William Pye, 1870-1935. The two trebles of this peal were given by the Ringing Exercise in memory of a great ringer.

Second: All these were honoured in their generations and were the glory of their times.

The treble, in note G, weighs 5 cwt. 18 lbs, and the second, in F sharp, weighs 5 cwt. 2 qr. 11 lbs. Both bells bear the name of the founder and the date, 1936.

The work of casting these two bells, together with tuning two of the other six bells, and all necessary alterations, was satisfactorily carried out by Messrs. Gillett and Johnston. The Bishop also dedicated a marble tablet which has been placed in the church porch, and which contains the following inscription:—

WILLIAM PYE  
Church Bell Ringer,  
Born August 14, 1870—Died March 8, 1935.

The two smallest bells in the tower of this church were given by the Ringing Exercise in memory of one of the greatest men in the history of change-ringing.

The fund raised to carry out this work was subscribed to by ringers from all parts of England, and from Wales, Scotland, Ireland, and overseas. Some 36 of the societies affiliated to the Central Council, 50 ringing bands, and about 200 individual ringers sent donations. A small balance of the fund remains, with which it is hoped to record one of William Pye's greatest performances, the peal of 7392 Cambridge Surprise Maximus rung at St. Mary-le-Bow, Cheapside, on December 19, 1925, and to add a suitable footnote to the tablet.

The 39th Annual General Meeting was held at St. Mary's, Ealing, on Saturday, April 25th. The preacher was the Rev. W. Paton, Vicar of St. Lawrence's, Brentford, and the service was attended by some 70 members.

The business meeting was held under the chairmanship of the President. At the outset Mr. J. A. Trollope reminded the meeting that Mr. C. T. Coles, one of their joint hon. secretaries, had completed 25 years service in that office. On behalf of the members, he offered hearty congratulations and thanks to Mr. Coles, and expressed the hope that he would have many more years of success in ringing and in usefulness to this Association. These sentiments were embodied in a resolution, which was seconded by Mr. G. W. Fletcher and carried with acclamation.

The whole of the retiring officers were re-elected, and Messrs. C. T. Coles, G. W. Fletcher, W. H. Hollier, and W. G. Wilson, elected as representatives on the Central Council.

A resolution, expressing the hope that, if the church of All Hallow's, Lombard Street, be demolished, steps would be taken to retain as an entity the ring of ten bells, and to instal them in some other suitable tower, was passed. The Hon. Secretary was instructed to forward a copy of this resolution to the appropriate authorities if and when the demolition of the church becomes imminent.

An attractive programme of district meetings was arranged during the year. In the North and East District these took place at Southgate, Finchley, Pinner, Stanmore, Barnet, Bethnal Green, Clerkenwell and St. Giles-in-the-Fields, the attendances averaging 48. A Hertford and Middlesex Associations joint meeting was held at St. Albans, attended by some 60 ringers and friends. In the South and West District meetings were held at Twickenham, Chiswick, Isleworth, Sunbury, Feltham, Ruislip, Heston and Brentford, with an average attendance of 38. Two joint meetings were held, at Egham and Hillingdon respectively, the societies participating being the Guildford and Oxford Diocesan Guilds, and the Oxford Diocesan and Ladies Guilds, whilst the attendances reached 58 in one case and 83 in the other.

Although three honorary and 80 ringing members were elected, our membership at the end of the year shows only a slight increase, it now being 888. Eight members were lost by death, and

a very large number lapsed through removals, non-payment of subscriptions, etc. The lapses through avoidable causes is a matter for serious concern, and we do urge local secretaries, not only to see that subscriptions are promptly paid, but to keep the strength of their bands up to a number sufficient to man the bells regularly. Each band, besides being at full strength, should endeavour to teach at least one new ringer every year, and not wait for the time when recruits are so urgently needed that the bells cease, or almost cease, to be rung at all. The future of ringing generally, and of the Association in particular, depends upon the efforts of local leaders. See to it now.

Whilst regretting the losses mentioned above, it is satisfactory to note that a new band has been formed at St. Matthew's, Bethnal Green, and is making good progress under the tuition of the ringing master. At St. Ann's, Stamford Hill, a fresh start has been made, and ringing is in progress, and some recruits who have been given elementary instruction are looking forward soon to start learning change-ringing. Help will be appreciated at both these towers, the ringing times will be found in the appropriate columns of this report. We hope next year to record that the towers which have ceased to show any membership at all will once again have come into the fold.

The peal list shows an increase on last year, 55 having been rung. The increase, however, is almost entirely in handbell peals, and we hope that in this, the Coronation year, there will be a real revival in peal ringing. Of the 55 peals rung, 10 were on handbells, and the tower bell peals were rung at 26 churches. The members taking part in the peals numbered 159, a few in excess of last year, and four members rang their first peals. There were 23 conductors, an increase of four. Some 85 members rang their first peals in something new, including several "firsts" on handbells, five of Spliced Surprise Major in seven methods, two of Cambridge Royal, 21 of various Surprise Major methods, and seven of Stedman Caters.

Those members ringing their first peals include Miss Freda Clayton and Henry D. Butler (Harrow Weald); F. C. Taylor (Walthamstow); and R. G. Spears (Kingsbury).

Peals calling for special mention include four rung half-muffled in memory of His late Majesty King George V; one in honour of the Accession of His Majesty King Edward VIII; and two for the Accession of His Majesty King George VI.

The 80th birthday of Mr. R. J. Maynard, of St. Mary's, Walthamstow, was celebrated by a peal at that church on September 26th. Mr. Maynard has been a ringer at Walthamstow for 71 years, and a member of this Association since its formation.

A peal of Cambridge Surprise Major was rung at St. Olaves, Hart Street, City, on February 15th, conducted by Mr. G. Williams,

by a band each of whom had previously rung over 1000 peals. It might truly be said that they had had plenty of practice for this peal.

Methods rung to peals for the first time by the Association include Erin Triples at Denham on February 1st, conducted by Mr. M. F. R. Hibbert; Oxford Bob Major at Edmonton on March 21st, conducted by Mr. E. H. Lewis; and Wembley Surprise Major at Willesden on June 30th, conducted by Mr. J. A. Trollope; whilst Mr. E. C. S. Turner conducted a peal in seven Surprise Major methods (spliced) at St. Mary's, Staines, on March 28th, a very fine performance indeed.

The summary of quarter-peals, which is to be found in its usual place in this report, shows a decrease in the number rung, although the towers at which they were rung remain very much the same as last year. Southgate heads the list with 15, nine less than in 1935, whilst most other towers also show a decrease. This is a matter which might easily be rectified with a little extra output of energy and enthusiasm.

The supper held in the South and West District continues to be well supported. That held on January 4th last year was attended by some 78 members and friends.

There is only one item of bell-restoration work to record, and that a very small one. Messrs. J. Taylor & Co. report the fitting of ball-bearings to the peal of ten bells at St. Luke's Church, Chelsea.

Our sympathies go out to Mr. W. H. Hollier, our Hon. Treasurer, whose wife died on December 2nd. Mrs. Hollier was well-known to many of us, often accompanying her husband to Association and Central Council meetings. Mr. Hollier himself had a serious illness last year, and was devotedly nursed by his wife not long before she herself was taken.

In conclusion, we thank our Joint Hon. Secretaries, and indeed, all our officers, for their work, and we urge all members of the Association to give them their utmost support.

## In Memoriam.

Members lost to us by death during 1936.

Rev. A. H. F. BOUGHEY.—Died on September 22nd, age 87. He was for 57 years President of the Cambridge University Guild, and from 1918 to 1921 was President of the Central Council. He joined this Association in 1905, and became an Hon. Vice-President in 1914. During his period of membership he rang in 15 peals, several of them being on handbells, in which branch of ringing he was expert. He did great service to ringing by interesting undergraduates in the art, and was the ringing tutor of many well-known ringers.

R. CROUCH, Dalston.—Died on August 25th, age 53. As a member of the band at St. Mark's, Dalston, he joined this Association in 1929. He was local secretary for four years.

HENRY S. ELLIS, Westminster.—Died on September 26th, age 78. He was at one time a member of a famous band at St. Stephen's, Rochester Row, and latterly a ringer at St. Margaret's, Westminster. He joined this Association in 1923, and rang in four peals with us.

JOHN LEE, Clapham.—Died on February 10th, age 71. He had been a member since 1921, and rang in two Association peals.

ROBERT K. KNIGHT, Leytonstone.—Died on March 21st, age 91. For many years a member of the St. Mary's, Walthamstow, band, he joined this Association in 1897, and during his active membership rang in two peals.

ERNEST D. LILLYWHITE, Walthamstow.—Died on December 18th, age 61. He was ringing master at St. Saviour's, Walthamstow, for 30 years. He joined this Association at its formation, and rang in nine peals.

WILLIAM RICHARDSON, Pinchbeck.—Died on October 12th, age 52. He joined this Association in 1909, when he rang his only peal with us.

WILLIAM E. TAYLOR, Maidenhead.—Died on February 5th, age 64. He was a member for nine years, during which period he rang in six peals with the Association.



## CENTRAL COUNCIL NEWS.

THE 44th Annual Meeting of the Council was held in the Council Chamber at the Guildhall, London, on Whit-Tuesday. There was a record attendance of 114 members, including all four representatives of this Association, and two of our most prominent members, Messrs. J. A. Trollope and E. C. S. Turner, honorary members of the Council.

The Dean of St. Paul's offered a hearty welcome to the Council, on behalf of the Cathedral authorities, the Lord Mayor, and the Corporation and citizens of London. A telegram was sent to the King offering loyal congratulations to His Majesty on his Accession. Later in the day a message of thanks was received from His Majesty.

Mr. E. H. Lewis was re-elected president, and Mr. G. W. Fletcher honorary secretary and treasurer, whilst Mr. W. H. J. Hooton was elected honorary librarian.

The usual routine business of the Council was taken and the various committees' reports discussed.

The following resolutions were adopted by the Council:—

- 1.—“That compositions which contain more than one method shall be called ‘Spliced,’ provided that the methods are so joined that the fundamental units of which they are constructed (*i.e.*, the ‘Leads’ in the case of Treble-dominated methods, the ‘Sixes’ in the case of Stedman, Duffield and similar methods, etc.) remain intact.  
“That reports of all Spliced peals shall include a reference to the number of methods rung and the number of changes from one method to another during the peal.”
- 2.—“The Council requests all members and secretaries of affiliated societies to send in suggestions with a view to increasing the circulation of ‘The Ringing World,’ these suggestions to be considered by the officers of the Council and Mr. Goldsmith, and a report circulated to the members.”
- 3.—“That with a view to providing future guidance, the officers of this Council be requested to consider the question of the correct method of muffling and ringing church bells on occasions of national and local mourning.”
- 4.—“That all persons having collection of books on ringing matters be invited to supply particulars to the hon. librarian and to indicate whether they are willing to give access to their collections.”

This was the first meeting under the new rules of the Council, whose decisions are now binding on affiliated societies.
