The curfew was rung regularly here during the winter months at 8 p.m. until thirty or forty years back, when it was discontinued owing to the economy of the local authorities. E Walford *Village London* 1883-84.

December 4 1929 peal of Stedman Triples. VP: this is not the first peal. Find author.
PN: first peal in the method by the conductor. MCALDG *Annual report* 1929.

N. tower with cupola. Tower late 14th century, rebuilt 1820. Bells: eight (five 1716, recast 1902). LMAS *Transactions* vol. 18 (1955)

Tuesday October 28 1902 in 2h 56m. 5040 Grandsire Triples. Holt's ten-part. First peal on the bells. MCALDG *Annual report* 1902.
