



- 4.—Ringers of peals in affiliated Towers situate in the South and West District will pay 3d. to the District Bell Restoration Fund. These moneys must be collected by the conductor of the peal and forwarded to the District Honorary Secretary. Ringers of their first peals are exempt from this rule.

RULES.

I.—The Association shall be called "The Middlesex County Association and London Diocesan Guild of Change-Ringers." It was formed on June 7th, 1897, by a union of the Middlesex Association and the South and West Middlesex Guild, and these Societies are hereinafter known as the North and East, and South and West Districts of the County Association.

II.—Its objects are (1) the recognition of the true position of Ringers as Church Officials; (2) the due care and use of Church Bells and Belfries; and (3) the cultivation of the art of Change-Ringing.

III.—The government of the Association shall be vested in a Committee (hereinafter referred to as the Central Committee) consisting of the following members, of whom five shall form a quorum, viz:—

- (a) The Bishop of the Diocese, who, being a member, shall be ex-Officio Patron of the Association.
- (b) The President, Master, Secretaries and Treasurer of the Association.
- (c) The Vice-Presidents, Masters, Treasurers and Secretaries of each District of the Association.
- (d) Three members elected annually by each District, as hereinafter provided. The President, Master, Secretary and Treasurer of the Association shall retire annually at the Annual General Meeting, but shall be eligible for re-election, provided always that the District Secretaries for the time being may, if thought fit, be at the same time Joint Secretaries of the Association.

IV.—The Association shall consist of Honorary and Ringing Members. Honorary Members shall subscribe not less than 5s. annually, or by a donation of not less than £1 1s. become Life Members. Such Members may be admitted by the Secretaries at any time. Ringing Members shall pay an Annual Subscription of 1s. 6d., and all subscriptions shall become due on January 1st in each year. A Life Subscription of 5s. may, however, be accepted from non-resident Members in lieu of the annual payment of 1s. 6d.

V.—The following expenses shall be paid by the Treasurer of the Association out of the moneys to be remitted to him by the Treasurer of each District, as hereinafter provided, viz:—

- (a) The expenses of the Annual Meeting.
- (b) The fees and expenses of representatives of the Central Council.
- (c) The travelling expenses of the Central Committee.
- (d) The cost of printing the Annual Report.
- (e) Postage, Stationery, and other incidental expenses.

VI.—No person shall be admitted as a Ringing Member if he belongs to a band, till he be certified by the captain of his band to be a change-ringer or desirous of learning change-ringing—or if he does not belong to a band, till he be recommended to the Central Committee by two Ringing Members of the Association; but any person duly certified or recommended as aforesaid, shall be admitted as a Ringing Member at any General or District Meeting of the Association.

VII.—The Annual General Meeting of the Association shall be held on the second or third Saturday after Easter, for the purpose of electing officers, transacting business, and for united practice in change-ringing. At such Meeting a report of proceedings and a statement of accounts shall be presented, and the place of the next Annual General Meeting fixed. All other General Meetings may be arranged by the Central Committee, and the times and places of ensuing District Meetings shall be arranged by the District Secretaries, as empowered by a majority of Members present at the last District Meeting held.

VIII.—That any person wishing to attempt a peal may be proposed, seconded and elected in the tower, provided there be a majority of members present. The conductor of the peal shall be responsible for collecting the subscription of the newly-elected member previously to the attempt being made, and shall at once report the election to the Secretary in whose District the peal is attempted, in order that the same may be ratified at the next District Meeting.

IX.—Members whose subscriptions are more than one year in arrear, shall be deemed to have withdrawn from the Association.

X.—The chief endeavour of the Association being to instil greater reverence for God's House and worship among its members, any member misconducting himself may be dismissed at the discretion of the Central Committee, who shall report the same to the Annual General Meeting, and, in the event of his dismissal, such member shall forfeit any payment which he may have made to the Association.

XI.—That this Association be affiliated to the Central Council of Church Bell Ringers, and loyally abide by the Rules and Decisions thereof.

XII.—No alteration in or addition to these Rules shall be made except at an Annual General or Special Meeting of the Association, and notice of any proposed addition or alteration, or of any motion relating to any other matter in connection with the Association, must be sent in handwriting at least twenty-one days before one of such meetings.

NOTICE.—The Central Committee will be happy to assist the Clergy in framing Rules for the proper management of their Ringers and Belfries.

RULES FOR THE DISTRICT SOCIETIES.

I.—Each District Society shall hold a meeting not later than the second Saturday in February in each year for the election of its Officers and representatives on the Central Committee of the Association, and shall be at liberty to manage its own business, collect its own subscriptions, and publish its separate Balance Sheets.

II.—The District Secretaries shall receive all subscriptions in their Districts, and remit them to the Treasurer. They shall also satisfy themselves, by personal inspection or otherwise, as to the state of Belfries and Bands in their Districts, and make a yearly report for presentation to the Central Committee.

III.—The Treasurer of each District shall remit to the Treasurer of the Association 60 per cent. of the subscriptions received by him from his District Secretary, the remainder of such subscriptions being retained by the District for its own use.

IV.—Each band of Ringers in the Association shall appoint a Local Secretary, who shall collect the subscriptions, and with whom the General Secretaries shall correspond.

V.—There shall be a Committee in each District, consisting of (a) the representatives of the District on the Central Committee of the Association, and (b) one representative from each tower in the District in union with the Association. These Committees shall meet from time to time for the transaction of any business affecting the District not provided for in the foregoing Rules.

VI.—Bands desirous of employing an instructor should apply to one or other of the District Secretaries, who will endeavour, so far as funds permit, to meet their wishes.

REPORT, 1932.

THE 35th Annual Meeting was held at Twickenham on Saturday, April 9th. The President occupied the chair, and was supported by The Bishop of Willesden, who, at the service in the afternoon, had given a very inspiring address to a large congregation. Besides nearly all the Association officials, about 100 members were present.

Before any business was done, sympathetic reference was made by the President to the death of Dr. Maud, Bishop of Kensington, who less than a year previously had shown his interest in ringing by dedicating the two new bells at Isleworth.

Mr. W. H. Hollier, who had recently relinquished the joint-secretaryship, was elected Hon. Treasurer in place of Mr. C. T. Coles. Mr. F. W. Goodfellow was elected joint-secretary. As a mark of appreciation of the work done by Mr Hollier during his eleven years as joint-secretary, he was elected a life honorary member of the Association.

A proposal by the Central Committee that the Association should entertain members of the Central Council to tea on the occasion of the 1933 meeting in London was approved.

The following resolution, to be sent to The Bishop of London, was passed by the meeting:—

"The Middlesex County Association and London Diocesan Guild of Change Ringers desires most respectfully to call the attention of the Lord Bishop of the Diocese to the great artistic and historical value of the bells at St. Andrew's, Wells Street, and expresses the earnest hope that if it is not possible to build a sufficiently strong tower at the new Church of St. Andrew, Kingsbury, they will not be either broken up, dispersed, or placed in a tower not suitable, but will be given to some Church in the Diocese where there is a tower sufficiently strong to enable them to be hung for proper ringing."

This action of the Association was afterwards supported by the London County Association and by the Central Council.

A sum of two guineas was voted to the fund which is being raised by the Gloucester and Bristol Diocesan Association for the purpose of erecting a memorial to the late Rev. C. D. P. Davies, for many years Hon-Secretary to the Central Council.

District meetings in 1932 were held at the following places, viz., in the N. and E. District, at Edmonton, Upper Clapton, Finchley, Enfield (St. Mary's), Northaw, Stanmore, Stamford Hill, Southgate, and Kilburn, and in the S. and W. District, at Isleworth, Feltham, Hillingdon (St. Andrew's), Heston, Sunbury, Harlington, Staines, Stanwell, Ealing (St. Mary's) and Brentford. In these days of depression, when money is scarce, it is not to be wondered at that attendances are below the usual standard, but we do urge members to do their utmost to be present at meetings, to give encouragement to the few who habitually attend, and to the Secretaries and Masters who arrange them.

The Stanwell meeting, which was in the nature of an outing, rather than a formal meeting, gave members an opportunity of ringing at three towers not affiliated to the Association. The Harlington meeting brought a request from the Church authorities for advice and assistance in the forming of a new band of ringers, and we hope we shall be able to welcome Stanwell and Harlington to our ranks at an early date. Joint meetings were held at St. Albans, Enfield (St. Andrew's), and Hillingdon (St. John's), jointly with the Bedford and Hertford Associations, the Essex and Hertford Associations, and the Oxford Diocesan Guild respectively. These joint meetings are still a popular feature of our yearly programme.

We welcome the ringers at St. Augustine's, Kilburn, to membership, as well as those at Norwood Green, who have rejoined after a short period outside the Association. We trust they will long remain loyal members, and urge them to regularly attend Association meetings.

Including the ringers at these towers we elected two Honorary and fifty-nine Ringing members, of which number the S. and W. District can claim a slight majority, and our total membership of 868 shows a small increase on last year. The number of lapses owing to non-payment of subscriptions is again to be regretted, and in addition to drawing the attention of members to the suggestions we made last year, we also suggest that only by continuous recruiting can local guilds be kept up to full strength. At least one new ringer annually should be the aim of each band; it will be found much easier to keep the strength up by this means than by waiting for the time to come when it is necessary to recruit in a wholesale fashion.

Compared with 1931 there was an increase of seven in the number of peals rung. Out of a total of 83, four were rung on handbells, and the Churches at which peals were rung numbered 33. Twelve members rang their first peals, and in congratulating them all we are glad to note that three members of the newly

affiliated Kilburn band, and three of the Enfield (St. Andrew's) society, are included in this number. The Misses Greenall and Wheeler, of Enfield, have joined the ever growing number of peal ringing ladies.

Members who took part in the peals numbered 168, an increase of 23 over the previous year. The increasing popularity of Spliced Surprise ringing is shown by nine members ringing their first peals in four methods. Members who rang their first peals in the more advanced methods included two London, two Bristol, and six Cambridge Royal. One member rang his first peal of Stedman Cinques, and one Maximus. In all some 126 members rang their first peals in something new, which, we venture to say, is a sure sign of progress. There were 24 conductors, and Mr. R. T. Newman is to be congratulated on conducting a peal for the first time. Amongst the seven peals of Spliced Surprise Major was one in four methods at Bishopsgate on February 22nd, which Mr. C. W. Roberts conducted from a non-observation bell! The first peals ever rung in seven and eight Surprise methods were accomplished at Willesden on April 19th and June 21st respectively, both conducted by Mr. W. Pye, and the first peal of Belgrave Surprise Major by the Association was rung at Bishopsgate on October 3rd, conducted by Mr. C. W. Roberts.

The bells at St. Mary's, Finchley, which early in the year were retuned and rehung in a new metal frame by Messrs Gillett and Johnston, were reopened on March 19th, on which occasion members were the guests of the Rector at tea. As provision has been made in the new frame for two additional bells, we may confidently hope that Finchley will soon be favoured with an octave. Messrs. Gillett and Johnston have also recast and rehung the tenor bell at West Drayton in a new metal frame, suitable for six bells. Messrs. Mears and Stainbank have rehung the peal of eight at St. Andrew's, Hillingdon, in new bearings, with satisfactory results. It is sincerely hoped that the famous peal at St. Mary-le-Bow, Cheapside, will soon be restored. The contract has been placed with the Croydon Foundry.

The first broadcast by a South and West District tower was given by the Staines (St. Peter's) band during the year, and the ringers are to be congratulated on a creditable performance. We hope that any of our bands which have the privilege of broadcasting their bells will be satisfied with nothing less than the very best striking. Well struck rounds is preferable to poorly struck change-ringing.

The venture of the South and West District in holding a supper and social at Heston on January 14th of the present year (1933) met with success, some 75 members and friends attending. It is confidently hoped that this function will be the first of many such gatherings.

We learned with regret during the year of the accident and subsequent illness which befel Mr. W. H. Hollier, and are glad to be able to say that he has fully recovered.

Mr. W. Webb, of the St. Mary's, Finchley, band, has completed 57 years as a ringer at that Church, and Mr. F. Pratt has been a ringer at St. Mary's, Hendon, for 54 years. Both these gentlemen appear in the first report of the old Middlesex Association, dated 1890, and have had an unbroken line of membership. Mr. Pratt, we are sorry to say, has recently had to give up ringing owing to ill health, but we hope this will be of a temporary nature and that both he and Mr. Webb will enjoy their bell-ringing for many years to come.

The Central Council at its last meeting passed a resolution urging greater support for "The Ringing World." The Editor of that journal promised a larger paper if sufficient new readers were forthcoming, but apart from that, we think that ringers should, in their own interests and in the interests of the Association, support it to the limit of their ability to do so. The difficulties of running an Association without a convenient means of communication with members would be so great as to be almost insuperable. It would be a bad day for the exercise if "The Ringing World" ceased to appear, and we do urge members generally to support it.

In Memoriam.

Members lost to us by death during 1932.

EDWIN BARNETT, of Crayford. Died on August 13th, aged 70. He had been a member since 1899, and had rung in 56 Association peals, ten of which he conducted. He was a splendid worker for the exercise, quiet and unassuming, yet strong in his opinions. He was a most lovable man, and to have known him was a privilege. Although a great peal ringer, he was never happier than when helping a beginner through his first peal, quarter-peal, or touch, however simple the method might be. He represented the Kent County Association on the Central Council from 1903 until his death.

FRANK J. DAVEY, of Exeter. Died, at the age of 65, on November 17th. He was a member of the Exeter Cathedral band. He joined this Association in 1927, on the occasion of ringing his only peal with us.

HENRY EDGELEY. Died on November 1st. He was Churchwarden at All Saints, Isleworth, and was largely responsible, with Mr. Hollier, for raising the money for augmenting the bells at that Church two years ago. He had been an Honorary member since 1918, and always took an active interest in the Association. A half-muffled peal was rung at Isleworth on November 5th.

GEORGE GRIMWADE, of Walthamstow. Died on June 26th at the advanced age of 84. He was a kindly disposed man, and had been a member of the Association since 1899. He rang in six Association peals.

REV. C. E. A. ROWLAND. Died suddenly on August 26th, at the age of 63. He was Vicar of Pinner for 22 years, and was responsible for the restoration of the bells a few years ago. He was a good friend to his ringers, and, in a difficult neighbourhood, could be relied upon to support them when unjustified complaints of excessive ringing were made. He had been an Honorary member since 1927. A half-muffled peal was rung at Pinner on September 3rd.
