

## SHOREDITCH, ST LEO.

The tower is situated at the west end of the church designed by George Dance.

There are some peal boards in the porch. Access to the second floor ringing room is via a stone staircase located in the north-east corner of the main entrance. The ringing room is large with a medium high ceiling and a window on the north and south walls.

The belfry is located on the fourth floor accessed via the continuation of the main staircase.

The bells have metal headstocks and are hung on roller bearings in a two tier cast iron 'H' and low sided frames installed in 1913. (CHECK) The 2<sup>nd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup>, 5<sup>th</sup>, 6<sup>th</sup>, 10<sup>th</sup> and sharp 2<sup>nd</sup> bells are hung on the top tier. Boxes are used to stand on to ring the 10<sup>th</sup>, 11<sup>th</sup> and tenor bells.

The bells are rung in full circle.

The tenor of the former ring is situated on the floor of the south aisle of the church hung in a cast iron 'A' frame, complete with wheel and bell rope.
