## RULES.

1.—The Association shall be called "The Middlesex County Association and London Diocesan Guild of Change-Ringers." For the purpose of administration it shall be divided into two districts, to be known as the North and East District, and the South and West District.

2.—The objects of the Association are (1) the recognition of the true position of ringers as church workers; (2) the due care and use of church bells and belfries; and (3) the promotion and advancement of the art of change-ringing.

3.—The Association shall consist of honorary and ringing members. Honorary members shall subscribe not less than 5s. annually, or by a donation of not less than £1 1s. become life-members. Such members may be admitted at any time. Ringing members shall pay an annual subscription of 1s. 6d., and all subscriptions shall become due on January 1st in each year. A life subscription of 5s. may, however, be accepted from non-residents in lieu of the annual payment of 1s. 6d. Life members coming to reside within the area of the Association shall pay an annual subscription of 1s. 6d. except during the first two years after the payment of the life subscription of 5s. Such members may, on leaving the area of the Association, revert to the status of life-members if they so desire. Members shall be deemed to have withdrawn from the Association if their subscriptions become more than one year in arrear.

4.—The government of the Association shall be vested in a committee (hereinafter referred to as the Central Committee) consisting of the following members, of whom five shall form a quorum, viz. :—

- (a) The President, Active Vice-Presidents, Master, Secretary, Treasurer, one of the Trustees, and the Representatives on the Central Council of Church Bell-Ringers.
- (b) The District Masters and Secretaries, and their Deputies.
- (c) Three members elected by each district.

The President, Active Vice-Presidents, Master, Secretary, Treasurer, and three Trustees, shall be elected annually at the annual general meeting. The District Masters and Secretaries and their Deputies, and the three members of each district, shall be elected annually at the annual meeting of their district.

5.—There shall be a committee in each district, consisting of the following members of whom five shall form a quorum, viz. :—

- (a) The representatives of the district on the Central Committee, and (b) one representative from each tower in the district having members in the Association.

These committees shall meet from time to time for the purpose of transacting any business of the district not provided for in the rules of the Association.

6.—The annual general meeting of the Association shall be held on a Saturday, as soon as possible after Easter, for the purpose of electing officers, transacting business, and for united practice in change-ringing. At such meetings the annual report and statement of accounts shall be presented, and the place of the next annual general meeting fixed. Other general meetings may be arranged by the Central Committee.

7.—Each district shall hold a meeting not later than the second Saturday in February in each year for the election of its officers and representatives on the Central Committee. It shall manage the business of the district, collect subscriptions, and publish its separate statement of accounts.

8.—Members may be elected at any general or district meeting, on the proposition of two members. Members may also be provisionally elected previous to a peal attempt on the proposition of two members, provided that not less than half the band are already members. Any such election must be confirmed at the next meeting of the district in which the provisional election takes place, and the subscription must be paid not later than the date of this meeting.

9.—The Central Committee shall have power to suspend any member who conducts himself in a manner likely to bring discredit upon the Association. Any such suspension shall be reported at the next general meeting of the Association, when the suspended member may be dismissed and shall forfeit any payment that he may have made to the Association.

10.—The Secretary of each district shall remit to the Treasurer of the Association the balance of the subscriptions received by him after payment of the normal running expenses of his district.

11.—The Treasurer is authorised to pay out of the funds of the Association the following :—

- (a) The expenses of the annual general meeting.
- (b) The travelling expenses of the Central Committee.
- (c) The cost of printing the Annual Report.
- (d) Postages, stationery, and other incidental expenses.
- (e) The fee due to the Central Council of Church Bell-Ringers.
- (f) The expenses of Representatives on the Central Council of Church Bell-Ringers.

12.—The Central Committee shall be empowered to authorise any expenditure not provided for in rules 11 and 14.

13.—Each band of ringers in the Association shall appoint a local secretary, who shall collect the subscriptions of his band, and with whom the District Secretaries shall correspond.

14.—District Secretaries are authorised so far as funds permit, to pay the expenses of an instructor for any band in the Association, should such be applied for.

15.—The District Secretaries shall satisfy themselves, by personal inspection or otherwise, as to the state of belfries and bands in their districts, and make a yearly report to the Central Committee.

16.—The conductor of any peal rung for the Association shall forward the composition to the Secretary within one month of the date on which it is rung, unless such composition is apparent from the report published in the ringing paper for the time being in circulation.

17.—The Association shall be affiliated to the Central Council of Church Bell Ringers, and shall loyally abide by the rules and decisions thereof. Representatives shall be elected in accordance with the rules of the Church.

18.—No alteration in or addition to these rules shall be made except at an annual general or special meeting of the Association, and notice of any proposed addition or alteration must be sent to the Secretary in writing at least 21 days before one of such meetings.

**NOTICE.—The Central Committee will be happy to assist the Clergy in framing Rules for the proper management of their Ringers and Belfries.**

#### IMPORTANT.

Certificates of Membership, 6d. each (post free) may be obtained by any member who has rung in a touch of not less than 120 changes, from either of the District Secretaries.

## REPORT, 1940—1945

1940.

ON June, the Minister of Home Security imposed a ban on the ringing of Church Bells. These were reserved for use as a warning of any airborne invasion which at one time appeared imminent.

The Annual General Meeting was held at Acton on 27th April. The sermon was preached by the Rector (Rev. P. Gough). At the business meeting the committee was given powers to decide in what form to issue the Annual Report, because of high costs of printing and the paper shortage. As the position became worse, the Committee decided to issue abridged reports until such time as our activities became normal. It was also decided that the application of Rule 3 should not be insisted upon in the cases of members serving in H.M. Forces, and that any ringer serving in the Forces and stationed in the London area, could become a member for the period of the war on payment of one year's subscription.

District Meetings were held at Upper Clapton, St. Giles in the Fields, Stepney, St. George in the East, Heston, Brentford and Ruislip, with generally good attendances.

Twenty-two peals were rung, only one of them on tower bells at Willesden. There were 24 ringers and 6 conductors in these peals.

One Honorary and 13 Ringing Members were elected. Rev. A. S. Roberts, who came into the county a few years previously, removed to Cornwall to take charge of the parish of Carbis Bay.

The books belonging to the Association, which had hitherto been kept in the belfrey at St. Giles in the Fields, were removed for greater safety to the home of Mr. T. J. Lock, at North Mimons.

Many Churches in the Diocese were very badly damaged in air raids, and many peals of bells were completely destroyed. A list of these will be found at the end of this report.

1941.

The Annual General Meeting was held at Kingsbury on 10th May, and was attended by 52 members and friends. The sermon was preached by the Rev. E. C. Bridgwater.

The continuance of the ban on the ringing of Church Bells, the damage caused to many Churches by enemy action and the black-out, made it extremely difficult for the District Secretaries to arrange any considerable number of meetings. Despite these difficulties, however, seven were held at Kilburn, Hadley, Stanmore, Upper Clapton, St. Botolph's, Bishopsgate, St. Stephen's, Ealing, and Heston, with attendances somewhat below the usual standard.

During the year 18 handbell peals were rung. Thirteen members took part in these and there were 5 conductors. Mr. H. Howson rang his first peal.

Five new members were elected.

1942.

The Annual General Meeting was held at Brentford on 16th May, Over 50 members and friends attended, and at the Service the sermon was preached by Rev. W. Paton.

Despite increasing difficulties meetings were held at Southgate, Cranford, Finchley, Acton, St. John's, Waterloo Road (Jointly with the Society of Cumberland Youths), and St. Botolph's, Bishopsgate.

Twenty-six handbell peals were rung, 33 members took part in these and there were 6 conductors. Among the peals rung was the first on handbells of Cambridge Surprise Major, by the Association. This was conducted by Mr. H. G. Cashmore. H. Harris rang his first peal and K. Arthur, F. E. Collins, P. A. Corby and H. M. Page, their first handbell peals.

Ten new members were elected.

On two occasions tower bell ringing was permitted and on each of these our members did their duty well. The first was for the Victory at El Alamein, which proved to be the turning point in our struggle against the Axis Powers. Bell ringing was also permitted on Christmas Morning.

During the year Mr. and Mrs. Fletcher removed from the County to Yarmouth. They have both been very valuable members of the Association, and their work has been of great assistance to our Secretaries.

Mr. Fletcher had been Vice-President since 1934.

1943.

The ban on ringing Church bells was partially removed to allow ringing on Easter Day and on a few Sundays following, and eventually by the end of May, all restrictions on ringing were removed.

The Annual General Meeting was held at St. Botolph's, Bishopsgate, on 15th May, with an attendance of 60. The Service was conducted by Rev. D. Oldaker who also gave the address. All the officers were re-elected with the exception of Mr. G. W. Fletcher, who felt compelled to resign his office of Vice-President owing to his removal from the county. Mr. C. T. Coles was elected to this office, and Mr. E. M. Atkins was appointed Auditor to fill the vacancies thus caused. A vote of thanks was accorded to Mr. and Mrs. Fletcher for their many years of sterling work for the Association.

Meetings were held at Kilburn, Clerkenwell (Jointly with the Society of Cumberland Youths), Pinner, Stanmore, Edmonton, Barnet, Hillingdon St. John (Jointly with the Oxford Diocesan Guild), Hillingdon St. Andrew, Cranford, Twickenham, Ruislip, Acton and Heston.

Peals rung numbered 24 of which 20 were on handbells. Mrs. C. D. Andrews and Messrs. E. A. Dench, D. H. L. Langdon, A. J. Wallman, and V. R. Woodards rang their first peals, all on handbells. The first peal of Spliced Surprise Major in four methods on handbells by the Association, was conducted by H. G. Cashmore. Forty members took part in these peals and there were 9 conductors.

The peal of Stedman Triples, rung at Crayford on 24th July, was the 1,000th by Messrs. J. Bennett and C. T. Coles, the latter conducting. It was arranged and rung in memory of Capt. F. G. Coles, M.C., son of the conductor, who was killed in action in Tunisia on 28th April, 1943.

Two honorary and 24 ringing members were elected.

#### 1944.

The Annual General Meeting was held at St. Giles in the Fields on 13th May. Some 70 members and friends attended and at the Service the address was given by Rev. W. Paton, Vicar of Brentford. At the business meeting all the officers were re-elected. The Hon. Treasurer stated that a loan of £8 had been made to The Central Council of Church Bell Ringers, towards the cost of purchasing The Ringing World.

Other meetings were held at: Clerkenwell, Kilburn, Harrow Weald, Wood Green, St. Botolph's, Bishopsgate, Fulham, Feltham, Brentford, Uxbridge, Cranford, Harmondsworth, Acton, Ealing (St. Mary's), Leytonstone (Jointly with the Essex Association), and Hillingdon (Jointly with the Oxford Diocesan Guild). Attendances averaged about 40 per meeting.

Peals rung numbered 84, all but 10 on handbells. Fifty-four members took part in these peals, there were 12 conductors. P. J. Coward, F. C. Price, R. E. Price, F. G. Robbins, W. D. Smith and H. Stratford, rang their first peals. The Edmonton band under the leadership of Mr. J. Thomas, continued their extraordinary progress, and amongst many fine performances on handbells, were five peals of Stedman Cinques, three of Grandsire Cinques, four of Bob Maximus and one of Plain Bob Fourteen, the first peal ever rung on that number in an even bell method.

One Honorary and 63 ringing members were elected.

#### 1945.

The Annual General Meeting was held at Clerkenwell on 12th May, with an attendance of over 70. The address at the Service was given by Rev. R. W. Ashby. At the business meeting, Mr. C. T. Coles

announced that he did not wish to be re-elected Hon. General Secretary, as he expected to leave the London area on his retirement. Mr. E. C. S. Turner was elected in his place, and Mr. C. T. Coles agreed to act as Assistant Hon. Secretary. All the other officers were re-elected. The Association is greatly indebted to Mr. Coles for his many years of work for us and his death early in 1946, was a great sorrow to our members.

The year saw the cessation of all hostilities, with the complete military collapse of Germany and Japan. We welcome back all of our members who have returned from service with H.M. Forces, not forgetting those who have been prisoners of war. We must be thankful that our losses have been few in number. A Thanksgiving Meeting and Service was held at Acton on 18th August, at which an address was preached by our President, Preb. W. P. Cole Sheane. At the conclusion, those of our members who had been killed in the war were remembered. These were:—

One of our members, Flt. Lieut. R. S. Knights, of Fulham, has been awarded the D.S.O. and D.F.C., for gallantry in Action, especially in regard to his part in sinking the German Battleship Tirpitz.

The first Joint Meeting with the Ancient Society of College Youths, was held at Southgate on 7th July. There was an attendance of about 60. This was the last meeting arranged by our late Secretary, Mr. C. T. Coles, who gave the Ancient Society a most cordial welcome.

Other meetings were held at: Kilburn, Christ Church, Isle of Dogs (Jointly with the Society of Royal Cumberland Youths), Enfield, Stanmore, Hadley, Tottenham, Gospel Oak, Chiswick, Heston (twice), Christ Church Ealing, Feltham, Cranford, St. Mary's, Staines, Harmondsworth and St. John's, Hillingdon (Jointly with the Oxford Diocesan Guild).

Two Honorary and 34 ringing members were elected.

Peals rung in 1945, totalled 71 of which 39 were on handbells. One hundred and eight members took part in these and there were 18 conductors. J. C. Birt, Miss P. Holmes, Miss L. Hubbert, S. Humphreys, D. R. Judd, B. D. Price, H. Smith, A. F. Thirst and C. Wenlan, rang their first peals.

The new Bishop of London, Rt. Rev. J. W. C. Wand, has very kindly consented to become Patron of the Association, in place of Dr. G. F. Fisher who has been appointed Archbishop of Canterbury.

Messrs. J. J. Pratt and W. Honor, both of the St. John's, Hillingdon band, completed 60 years service as ringers at their church.

### CENTRAL COUNCIL NEWS

The first meeting of the Central Council since 1939, was held in the Council Chamber of the City Hall, Birmingham, on Whitsun Tuesday, 1945. Three of our four representatives were present (Mr. W. G. Wilson was still abroad serving with the Army).

Of outstanding interest was the report on the acquisition of the "Ringing World," from the executors of the late Mr. J. S. Goldsmith. To finance the purchase, affiliated Societies were invited to advance on loan, a sum equivalent to £2 per representative. Our Association was among those which subscribed and the loan was repaid just over a year later.

Mr. J. A. Trollope, for many years one of our Active Vice-Presidents, has most ably edited "The Ringing World" since the death of Mr. Goldsmith. It is not an easy task to give readers something interesting to read each week, and the variety of articles (mostly written by the Editor) which have appeared during the war years, have without a doubt, maintained an interest in ringing when church bell ringing was prohibited.
