RULES.

I.—The Association shall be called "THE MIDDLESEX COUNTY ASSOCIATION AND LONDON DIOCESAN GUILD OF CHANGE-RINGERS." It was formed on June 7th, 1897, by a union of the Middlesex Association and the South and West Middlesex Guild, and these Societies are hereinafter known as the North and East, and South and West Districts of the County Association.

II.—Its objects are (1) the recognition of the true position of Ringers as Church Officials; (2) the due care and use of Church Bells and Belfries; and (3) the cultivation of the Art of Change-Ringing.

III.—The government of the Association shall be vested in a Committee (hereinafter referred to as the Central Committee) consisting of the following members, of whom five shall form a quorum, viz. :—

- (a) The Bishop of the Diocese, who, being a member, shall be ex-Officio Patron of the Association.
- (b) The President, Master, Secretaries and Treasurer of the Association.
- (c) The Vice-Presidents, Masters, Treasurers and Secretaries of each District of the Association.
- (d) Three Members elected annually by each District, as hereinafter provided. The President, Master, Secretary and Treasurer of the Association shall retire annually at the Annual General Meeting, but shall be eligible for re-election, provided always that the District Secretaries for the time being may, if thought fit, be at the same time Joint Secretaries of the Association.

IV.—The Association shall consist of Honorary and Ringing Members. Honorary Members shall subscribe not less than 5s. annually, or by a donation of not less than £1 rs. become Life Member. Such Members may be admitted by the Secretaries at any time. Ringing Members shall pay an Annual Subscription of 1s. 6d., and all subscriptions shall become due on January 1st in each year. A Life Subscription of 5s. may, however, be accepted from non-resident Members in lieu of the annual payment of 1s. 6d.

V.—The following expenses shall be paid by the Treasurer of the Association out of the moneys to be remitted to him by the Treasurer of each District, as hereinafter provided, viz. :—

- (a) The expenses of the Annual Meeting.
- (b) The fees and expenses of representatives of the Central Council.
- (c) The travelling expenses of the Central Committee.
- (d) The cost of printing the Annual Report.
- (e) Postage, Stationery, and other incidental expenses.

VI.—No person shall be admitted as a Ringing Member if he belongs to a band, till he be certified by the captain of his band to be a change-ringer or desirous of learning change-ringing—or if he does not belong to a band, till he be recommended to the Central Committee by two Ringing Members of the Association; but any person duly certified or recommended as aforesaid, shall be admitted as a Ringing Member at any General or District Meeting of the Association.

VII.—The Annual General Meeting of the Association shall be held on the Saturday in Easter week, for the purpose of electing officers, transacting business, and for united practice in change-ringing. At such Meeting a report of proceedings, and a statement of accounts shall be presented, and the place of the next Annual General Meeting fixed. All other General Meetings may be arranged by the Central Committee, and the times and places of ensuing District Meetings shall be arranged by the District Secretaries, as empowered by a majority of Members present at the last District Meeting held.

VIII.—That any person wishing to attempt a peal may be proposed, seconded and elected in the tower, provided there be a majority of members present. The conductor of the peal shall be responsible for collecting the subscription of the newly-elected member previously to the attempt being made, and shall at once report the election to the Secretary in whose District the peal is attempted, in order that the same may be ratified at the next District Meeting.*

IX.—Members whose subscriptions are more than one year in arrear, shall be deemed to have withdrawn from the Association.

X.—The chief endeavour of the Association being to instil greater reverence for God's House and worship among its members, any member misconducting himself may be dismissed at the discretion of the Central Committee, who shall report the same to the Annual General Meeting, and, in the event of his dismissal, such member shall forfeit any payment which he may have made to the Association.

XI.—No alteration in or addition to these Rules shall be made except at an Annual General or Special Meeting of the Association, and notice of any proposed addition or alteration, or any motion relating to any other matter in connection with the Association, must be sent in writing at least twenty-one days before one of such meetings.

NOTICE.—The Central Committee will be happy to assist the Clergy in framing Rules for the proper management of their Ringers and Belfries.

RULES FOR THE DISTRICT SOCIETIES.

I.—Each District Society shall hold a meeting not later than the second Saturday in February in each year for the election of its Officers and representatives on the Central Committee of the Association, and shall be at liberty to manage its own business, collect its own subscriptions, and publish its separate Balance Sheets.

II.—The District Secretaries shall receive all subscriptions in their Districts, and remit them to the Treasurer. They shall also satisfy themselves, by personal inspection or otherwise, as to the state of Belfries and Bands in their Districts, and make a yearly report for presentation to the Central Committee.

III.—The Treasurer of each District shall remit to the Treasurer of the Association 60 per cent. of the subscriptions received by him from his District Secretary, the remainder of such subscriptions being retained by the District for its own use.*

IV.—Each band of Ringers in the Association shall appoint a Local Secretary, who shall collect the subscriptions, and with whom the General Secretaries shall correspond.

V.—There shall be a Committee in each District, consisting of (a) the representatives of the District on the Central Committee of the Association, and (b) one representative from each tower in the District in union with the Association. These Committees shall meet from time to time for the transaction of any business affecting the District not provided for in the foregoing Rules.

VI.—Bands desirous of employing an instructor should apply to one or other of the District Secretaries, who will endeavour, so far as funds permit, to meet their wishes.

REPORT, 1926.

THE most satisfactory result of the work of the Association during the past year is the enrolment of an almost record number of new members, no less than 113 having joined our ranks during that period. Of these a considerable number represent additions to the bands at several of our towers, a result which we are glad to think is in some measure due to the appeal in our last report. Three new towers have been affiliated to the Association during the year, viz.:—St. Mark's, Dalston, and St. John the Baptist's, Pinner, in the North and East district; and St. Martin's, Ruislip, in the South and West district. Instruction is being given at each of these towers; and we hope that the enthusiasm at present manifested will be maintained, and that the bands at these towers will become a credit to the Association. New bands have also been formed at Christ Church, Ealing, and Harrow Weald; at the latter tower under the able guidance of Mr G. R. Goodship, and good progress is being made. At St. John's, Hillingdon, Twickenham, and Hadley, there have also been good increases in the bands.

To counter-balance these gains we have to regret the loss of the St. James', Clerkenwell, band, which, owing to the very bad condition of the bells, has broken up. We have also to regret that the Feltham band has dropped away, owing to lack of enthusiasm, but in this case we hope that something may be done to re-form a once promising local society. There are a few other towers where the ringers may, with advantage to themselves and the Association, make an endeavour to augment their ranks, and we would again urge upon our members the need of being continually on the look out for young people in whom to instil an interest in our art.

The 29th Annual General Meeting was held on April 10th at All Saints', Fulham. The preacher at the service was the Rev. J. H. Newsham-Taylor (Rector of Acton). Some 70 members attended, and made good use of the bells at Fulham, Hammersmith and Putney. Apart from ordinary routine business, and the re-election of the retiring officers, the most important item was the alteration of Rule 3 of the District Societies, which now permits of only 60 per cent. of the subscriptions collected by the districts being remitted to the Central Fund.

District meetings were held at St. Giles'-in-the-Fields; St. Mary's, Islington; Hendon; Stanmore and Harrow Weald; St. Mary's, Enfield; All Hallows', Barking, E.C.; and St. Mark's, Dalston; with two mid-week practice meetings at South Hackney and Tottenham. The attendances at these meetings in the North and East area of the Association reached the satisfactory average of 35.

Acton, Isleworth, Feltham, Chiswick, Sunbury, Ruislip, Twickenham, St. Peter's, Staines, and St. John's, Hillingdon, were the towers chosen by South and West district members for their meetings, and it is satisfactory to note that, with attendances averaging 37, the ringing at these meetings showed signs of improvement, and that whilst many of the higher methods were habitually practised, the learners always had as good an opportunity of ringing as the more advanced member.

The third annual joint meeting of the N. and E. district and S.W. division of the Essex Association was held at Waltham Abbey on August 14th, and was, as usual, well supported. Whilst we do not claim to have originated the idea of joint meetings, we note with satisfaction their increasing popularity up and down the country.

As stated in our opening paragraph, a large number of new members were enrolled during the year. Those elected in the North and East district numbered 71, including two honorary members; whilst 42 were elected in the South and West district. After allowing for losses by deaths, resignations, etc., we finish the year with the highest total in the history of the Association, viz., 826.

Losses by death numbered four, and two of these members belonged to the Northaw band. Charles Parker died on February 27th after two years of suffering. He had been a member of the Association since 1921, and was one of the most promising ringers in a most promising band. George Stevens, whose death occurred in 1925, joined the Association in 1911. By his death the Northaw band lost a most loyal member. The death of Isaac G. Shade from a street accident came as a great shock to us all. This sad event happened on July 19th, when he was knocked down by a motor-car, and instantly killed, in Blackheath Road, whilst on his way home after ringing at St. Botolph's, Bishopsgate. He had been a member for 28 years, and had rung in no less than 661 peals for the Association. These included the Bristol Surprise record and the first peal of Cambridge Surprise Maximus rung by the Association; and he also took part in four Surprise peals rung on one day. Mr. William Pye represented the Association at the funeral on July 23rd, and on the following day a half-muffled peal was rung at Willesden. William Lawrence, of West Ealing, died on October 11th. A man of wide interests, his hobbies included photography, collecting old bells and other curios, whilst he was also an active member of the Selborne Society. He had been

a member of the Association since 1905, and for three years was one of our representatives on the Central Council. His peals for the Association numbered 36, which included performances both on tower-bells and on handbells.

So far as the peals rung during the year are concerned, the total shows a slight decrease as compared with 1925. In all 57 peals were accomplished, and, with the exception of one on handbells, these were rung in 30 different towers. The members taking part in the peals numbered 160; whilst 20 shared in the conducting. Three members rang their first peals, and 60 their first peals in a new method. Amongst these first peals were eight of Bristol, five of New Cambridge, three of Cambridge, two of Superlative, eleven of Cambridge Royal, and two of Stedman Cinques. Miss R. Hawksworth rang her first peal of Double Norwich at Willesden on February 23rd, and Miss P. Moss her first of Stedman Caters at Walthamstow on June 19th. Miss E. E. Chapman rang her first peal of Cambridge Royal at St. Magnus the Martyr on July 3rd, whilst Mrs. F. I. Hairs rang in a peal of Middlesex Surprise Royal for the first time at Westminster on November 12th.

Mr. R. A. Fardon accomplished a fine performance when conducting his first peal of Stedman Triples by calling Carter's Odd-Bob One-Part composition at Acton on November 11th.

The Southgate Society are to be congratulated on ringing the first peal of Cambridge Royal for the Association by an entirely local band on April 17th, whilst a peal in three Cater methods was rung for the first time at St. Mary's, Walthamstow, on December 11th, conducted by one of the joint honorary secretaries.

Two other peals are worthy of special notice. Eight policemen rang a peal of Stedman Triples at St. Botolph's, Bishopsgate, on October 16th, this being the first peal in the method by members of the police force; whilst a peal of Bob Major, which was rung at Acton on December 9th, was accomplished by a band composed entirely of officers of the South and West district. This is the first time an "Officers' Peal" has been rung by the Association, and it is interesting to note that the whole of the officers of that district took part in the peal.

We might here mention that our worthy Ringing Master, Mr. William Pye, rang his 1,500th peal at Henley, Suffolk, on August 2nd.

Our list of quarter-peals is again a good one, and we are glad to be able to record an increased number at some of our towers. This year the list is headed by Tottenham, with 16 quarter-peals; which tower is closely followed by Hornsey (15), Isleworth (15) and Acton (13). Quite a large number of 720's of Doubles and Minor were also rung, mostly at Hornsey, Finchley, Stamford Hill, Hendon, Northaw, and Norwood Green.

Some important restorations of bells have taken place during the year. Messrs. John Taylor and Co. completely rehung the fine peal of ten bells at All Saints', Poplar, with new fittings and ball-bearings in entirely new framework. We can testify to the excellence of the work, as the Association was invited to re-open the bells with a peal of Stedman Caters, which was rung immediately after the re-dedication of the bells by the Bishop of Stepney on April 17th. The Loughborough firm is now rehunging the eight bells at St. Mary's, Ealing; and is recasting the fourth bell and rehunging the whole peal at St. Augustine's, Kilburn. The bells of St. John the Baptist, Pinner, were

re-opened on Sunday, October 31st, after being restored by Messrs. Mears and Stainbank, who recast the cracked tenor bell, and re-tuned the whole peal, which now hangs in ball-bearings in new iron framework. Here again the Association had the privilege of re-opening the bells, a peal of Stedman Triples being rung before Evensong on the day of the re-dedication of the bells by the Vicar, Rev. C. E. A. Rowland. Messrs. Mears and Stainbank are to be congratulated on a fine piece of work.

Messrs. Gillett and Johnston are at present engaged in overhauling the bells at St. John's, Hillingdon.

It is sincerely hoped that the Isleworth bells will be augmented to ten during 1927. The fund which is being raised for this purpose now amounts to £116, but a considerable further sum is needed before the work can be started.

The increasing number of our members who have so ably assisted us during the year by acting as voluntary instructors deserve our grateful thanks; as also do our honorary secretaries. We can best show our appreciation of the work done by the latter by a more frequent attendance at meetings. A well-attended meeting is a joy to the man who has taken pains to arrange it; a poorly attended meeting is, on the other hand, a great disappointment to him. Let us all resolve to bear this in mind.

We will close this brief report by wishing our old friend, Mr. T. Readle, who has had such a long and serious illness, a speedy and complete recovery; and we hope he will be with us for many years to come.
