The tower is situated at the west end of the church. The bells are rung from the first floor which is accessed by an uneven stone spiral clockwise staircase located in the south east corner of the tower. There is a short ladder down to the ringing room which is of medium size with a 12 feet ceiling

The clock is located on the east [should be north? PN 2021] wall of the ringing room and there is one chime hammer for the tenor. The bells are located immediately above on the second floor, accessed via a continuation of the staircase. The bells hang on one level in a timber low sided frame installed in 1959. The bells are on modern cast iron headstocks with independent staples and hung on ball bearings. None of the bells have retained their canons.

The Sanctus bell is bolted to wooden headstock which in turn is bolted to the bell frame and is located at 45 degrees to the pits of the 2nd and 3rd bells.
