Details of the bell added for the clock between 1806 and 1808? church guide

The clock bell was installed when the old church was repaired in 1770 - church guide

and again in 1827 the church was in need of repair, these 6 bells in the New Church. ^{church guide}

The ropes fell in a straight line in order North to South 3, 4, 5, 6, 2, 1. from the 6th edition of "Church Bells of Britain" by R H Dove.

The old church was enlarged in 1563 by William PATTER, Lord of the Manor church guide
