RULES.

I.—The Association shall be called "The Middlesex County Association and London Diocesan Guild of Change-Ringers." It was formed on June 7th, 1897, by a union of the Middlesex Association and the South and West Middlesex Guild, and these Societies are hereinafter known as the North and East, and South and West Districts of the County Association.

II.—Its objects are (1) the recognition of the true position of Ringers as Church Officials; (2) the due care and use of Church Bells and Belfries; and (3) the cultivation of the art of Change-Ringing.

III.—The government of the Association shall be vested in a Committee (hereinafter referred to as the Central Committee) consisting of the following members, of whom five shall form a quorum, viz:—

- (a) The Bishop of the Diocese, who, being a member, shall be ex-Officio Patron of the Association.
- (b) The President, Master, Secretaries and Treasurer of the Association.
- (c) The Vice-Presidents, Masters, Treasurers and Secretaries of each District of the Association.
- (d) Three members elected annually by each District, as hereinafter provided. The President, Master, Secretary and Treasurer of the Association shall retire annually at the Annual General Meeting, but shall be eligible for re-election, provided always that the District Secretaries for the time being may, if thought fit, be at the same time Joint Secretaries of the Association.

IV.—The Association shall consist of Honorary and Ringing Members. Honorary Members shall subscribe not less than 5s. annually, or by a donation of not less than £1 1s. become Life Members. Such Members may be admitted by the Secretaries at any time. Ringing Members shall pay an Annual Subscription of 1s. 6d., and all subscriptions shall become due on January 1st in each year. A Life Subscription of 5s. may, however, be accepted from non-resident Members in lieu of the annual payment of 1s. 6d.

V.—The following expenses shall be paid by the Treasurer of the Association out of the moneys to be remitted to him by the Treasurer of each District, as hereinafter provided, viz:—

- (a) The expenses of the Annual Meeting.
- (b) The fees and expenses of representatives of the Central Council.
- (c) The travelling expenses of the Central Committee.
- (d) The cost of printing the Annual Report.
- (e) Postage, Stationery, and other incidental expenses.

VI.—No person shall be admitted as a Ringing Member if he belongs to a band, till he be certified by the captain of his band to be a change-ringer or desirous of learning change-ringing—or if he does not belong to a band, till he be recommended to the Central Committee by two Ringing Members of the Association; but any person duly certified or recommended as aforesaid, shall be admitted as a Ringing Member at any General or District Meeting of the Association.

VII.—The Annual General Meeting of the Association shall be held on the second or third Saturday after Easter, for the purpose of electing officers, transacting business, and for united practice in change-ringing. At such Meeting a report of proceedings and a statement of accounts shall be presented, and the place of the next Annual General Meeting fixed. All other General Meetings may be arranged by the Central Committee, and the times and places of ensuing District Meetings shall be arranged by the District Secretaries, as empowered by a majority of Members present at the last District Meeting held.

VIII.—That any person wishing to attempt a peal may be proposed, seconded and elected in the tower, provided there be a majority of members present. The conductor of the peal shall be responsible for collecting the subscription of the newly-elected member previously to the attempt being made, and shall at once report the election to the Secretary in whose District the peal is attempted, in order that the same may be ratified at the next District Meeting.

IX.—Members whose subscriptions are more than one year in arrear, shall be deemed to have withdrawn from the Association.

X.—The chief endeavour of the Association being to instil greater reverence for God's House and worship among its members, any member misconducting himself may be dismissed at the discretion of the Central Committee, who shall report the same to the Annual General Meeting, and, in the event of his dismissal, such member shall forfeit any payment which he may have made to the Association.

XI.—That this Association be affiliated to the Central Council of Church Bell Ringers, and loyally abide by the Rules and Decisions thereof.

XII.—No alteration in or addition to these Rules shall be made except at an Annual General or Special Meeting of the Association, and notice of any proposed addition or alteration, or of any motion relating to any other matter in connection with the Association, must be sent in handwriting at least twenty-one days before one of such meetings.

NOTICE.—The Central Committee will be happy to assist the Clergy in framing Rules for the proper management of their Ringers and Belfries.

RULES FOR THE DISTRICT SOCIETIES.

I.—Each District Society shall hold a meeting not later than the second Saturday in February in each year for the election of its Officers and representatives on the Central Committee of the Association, and shall be at liberty to manage its own business, collect its own subscriptions, and publish its separate Balance Sheets.

II.—The District Secretaries shall receive all subscriptions in their Districts, and remit them to the Treasurer. They shall also satisfy themselves, by personal inspection or otherwise, as to the state of Belfries and Bands in their Districts, and make a yearly report for presentation to the Central Committee.

III.—The Treasurer of each District shall remit to the Treasurer of the Association 60 per cent. of the subscriptions received by him from his District Secretary, the remainder of such subscriptions being retained by the District for its own use.

IV.—Each band of Ringers in the Association shall appoint a Local Secretary, who shall collect the subscriptions, and with whom the General Secretaries shall correspond.

V.—There shall be a Committee in each District, consisting of (a) the representatives of the District on the Central Committee of the Association, and (b) one representative from each tower in the District in union with the Association. These Committees shall meet from time to time for the transaction of any business affecting the District not provided for in the foregoing Rules.

VI.—Bands desirous of employing an instructor should apply to one or other of the District Secretaries, who will endeavour, so far as funds permit, to meet their wishes.

Additions to above Rules, operative in South & West District only.

1. The meeting under rule 1 shall, if possible, be held at different towers in succession.
2. No member shall hold the post of Ringing Master for two consecutive years, unless all efforts to find a successor have failed.
3. Ringers of peals in affiliated Towers situate in the South and West District will pay 3d. to the District Bell Restoration Fund. These moneys must be collected by the conductor of the peal and forwarded to the District Honorary Secretary. Ringers of their first peals are exempt from this rule.

this man should be erected, and a movement is on foot to place two additional bells in the tower of St. John's Church, Leytonstone, to his memory. This project is receiving support from the Essex Association in particular, and from most of the other ringing organisations throughout the country, so that it can truly be described as a national memorial.

The 38th Annual General Meeting was held at St. Botolph's Church, Bishopsgate, on Saturday, May 4th. Coming in the midst of the jubilee celebrations, it was not surprising that the attendance was a record one. The service in St. Botolph's Church was attended by some 150 ringers and friends, including many from the provinces, who listened to an inspiring sermon preached by the Archdeacon of London.

At the business meeting reference was made to the death of the Master, and as a mark of respect all present stood in silence for a few moments.

Later in the meeting Mr. A. W. Coles was elected Ringing Master. Succeeding as he does such a great ringer as Mr. Pye, he will need all our support. His experience as Master of the North and East District will, however, stand him in good stead, and we look forward with confidence to a successful regime under his leadership.

The retirement of Mr. W. Pickworth necessitated a change in the President's deputy in the N. & E. District, and Mr. G. W. Fletcher was appointed by the President to this important position. His tact and good judgment have already assisted in the quick conduct of business at meetings.

Meetings in the North & East District were held at St. Giles-in-the-Fields, Hornsey, Dalston, Harrow Weald, Kingsbury, Hadley, Hendon, Tottenham, and Upper Clapton, with an average attendance of 38. Joint meetings took place at Northaw and Woodford.

In the South and West District, meetings were held at Hillingdon, Chiswick, Feltham, Isleworth, Twickenham, Ruislip, Stanwell, Brentford, and Heston, with an average attendance of 31. Joint meetings at Staines and Hillingdon West were very successful, the latter attracting a fine attendance of some 76 ringers and friends.

Three honorary and 56 ringing members were elected during the year. Nine members were lost by death, and a considerable number of lapses of membership have to be recorded. Our present total of members is 876, a few in excess of last year.

The peal list shows a very large decrease on the post-war record attained in 1934, only 45 peals, including one on handbells, having been rung last year. It is noticeable, however, that the

towers in which peals were rung, 28 in number, are only two less than in 1934, and that nearly the whole of the decrease in peals is due to many fewer being rung at one tower alone.

An analysis of the peals shows that 152 members took part in them, and that 14 rang their first peals. The latter figure is most gratifying. There were 19 conductors, whilst 49 members rang their first peals in a new method, including 3 of London, 4 of Spliced Surprise in four methods, 5 of Spliced Surprise in six methods, 2 of Cambridge Royal, and 2 of Stedman Cinques.

Those members ringing their first peals include Miss M. A. Prockson (Clerkenwell); Miss P. F. Knights (Edmonton); five members of the Sunbury band; and Reginald H. J. Goodship, son of one of our Asst. Hon. Secs., who has since joined the Royal Air Force, in which we wish him a successful career.

The most notable performance of the year was the peal of Spliced Surprise Major in four methods rung at St. Paulinus, Crayford, on March 23rd, by a band whose ages averaged only 22 years. This peal was composed and conducted by Mr. E. C. S. Turner, who called the same composition to a peal in six methods at St. Andrew's, Hillingdon, on July 27th.

A peal of Belvedere Surprise Major was rung for the first time at St. Mary's, Staines, on February 14th, conducted by Mr. A. R. Pink. Peals rung entirely by local bands include Cambridge Surprise Major at Willesden; Grandsire and Plain Bob Doubles at Sunbury; Superlative Surprise Major at Willesden; Kent Treble Bob Major at Heston; and Grandsire Triples at Edmonton.

Four peals were rung with muffled or half-muffled clappers in memory of Mr. William Pye; and three peals were rung in honour of the Royal Jubilee, including a peal of Stedman Cinques at St. Giles, Cripplegate, with the appropriate number of 5025 changes. This peal is recorded in the Church on a very fine peal board, the gift of the Vicar and Churchwardens.

The summary of quarter-peals will be found in its usual place in this report. It shows not only an increase in the number rung, but an increase in the number of towers in the list. The Heston, Southgate, and Willesden bands are to be congratulated on the variety of the methods rung. We are glad to be able to record some progress at several of our towers, notably at Chiswick, Feltham, and Kingsbury.

Mr. Thomas J. Lock has been elected Master of the N. & E. District on the retirement from that position of Mr. A. W. Coles, now Ringing Master of the Association. We wish Mr. Lock, who is one of our younger and most enthusiastic members, a successful term of office. Mr. W. H. Coles, another of our younger members, is Master of the S. & W. District for the year, and we feel sure he will fill the position to advantage.

The South and West District annual supper continues to be well-supported, and makes an opportunity for social intercourse between our members, which is evidently appreciated.

Our record of bell restoration is not an extensive one. It is, however, a pleasure to be able to say that the restoration at Harrow Weald has at last been accomplished. The original six bells have been retuned, and two new bells have been added, the octave being hung in a new frame to make a very fine peal. The work was done by Messrs. John Taylor & Co., and the new bells were dedicated on Easter Day by the Bishop of Willesden. Messrs. Gillett and Johnston have carried out minor repairs at St. John's Church, Hillingdon, including the cleaning and adjusting of the bearings.

In October Mr. C. T. Coles completed twenty-five years continuous service as honorary secretary of the North and East District and joint secretary of the Association. It is hardly necessary to say how much we owe to his able and devoted labours—that is surely known to every one of our members—yet there is a danger that we may take his work too much for granted and perhaps some of us may only realize his worth when the time comes for him to hand his task over to another and younger man. May that day be long delayed! Mr. Coles has not only served our Association, but he has taken an increasingly prominent and influential part in the life of the exercise at large, and he is one of the most respected members of the Central Council. We have also to thank Mr. Fred. Goodfellow, to whom the success and well-being of the South and West District is mainly due. Let us all resolve to show our gratitude by giving the secretaries our utmost support at meetings, and by the prompt payment of subscriptions.

In Memoriam.

Members lost to us by death during 1935.

A. S. ASKEW.—Died on December 15th. He was a ringer at All Saints' Church, Poplar, and had been a member of the Association for eight years.

HENRY A. BARNETT, at one time a member of the All Hallows', Tottenham, band, and a member of the Association since 1902, died in Canada during the year. He was about 52 years of age. He rang in two Association peals, both many years ago.

HENRY BLEE, of St. Mary's, Hornsey, died on August 19th, aged 59 years. His death was due to the after effects of a street accident, he having been knocked down by a car some weeks previously. He joined the Association in 1919, and rang in three peals.

REV. PROF. R. DE G. HAMPSON.—At one time curate at Christ Church, Southgate. He joined the Association as an honorary member in 1920, on the occasion of a meeting at Southgate, when he preached an extraordinarily fine sermon which is still fresh in the memories of many of us. His death took place in August.

REV. T. B. PARKER.—Rector of St. Mary's, Norwood Green, since 1921, and an honorary member for the same period. He died on April 15th, at the age of 75.

WILLIAM PYE, MASTER OF THE ASSOCIATION.—Died on March 8th, aged 64. "A truly remarkable man" was the description of him given in the Leytonstone parish magazine, and such a description is fully justified. Mr. Pye became a member of this Association in 1898, and in 1910 he was elected Ringing Master. For the whole period of his membership he led the way in ringing and his peals for the Association numbered 1,114, of which he conducted 859. Amongst these were several fine performances; the record of 15,264 Bristol Surprise Major at Hornchurch in 1912; the 10,440 Cambridge Surprise Royal at Walthamstow in 1923; the 7,392 Cambridge Surprise Maximus at St. Mary-le-Bow, Cheapside, on a 53cwt. tenor, in 1925; and the series of Spliced Surprise Major peals in from three to twelve methods which were rung at Willesden and elsewhere a few years ago, all of which he conducted. He was, too, a great handbell

ringer. The first peals of London and Bristol Surprise Major rung double-handed were conducted by him, as also was a short-course peal of Stedman Cinques from a pair of non-observation bells, which was rung early in 1914.

His peal performances over a wider field create a record which it will be difficult to beat. In all he rang 1,969 peals, including 172 on handbells. Of these he conducted 1,428. He called a peal on every one of the 366 dates of the year. He rang no less than 82 peals of Surprise Maximus, including the twelve-bell record of 15,312 Cambridge Surprise Maximus at Ashton-under-Lyne in 1929. He conducted the only two peals of Spliced Surprise Maximus ever rung, and assisted to ring the 72cwt. tenor at Exeter Cathedral to the only peal of Maximus rung on these bells. He rang this tenor single-handed to a peal in 1903, the only occasion on which this has been accomplished. Many other records stand to his credit, including the 18,027 Stedman Caters at Loughborough in 1909, and the 14,112 London Surprise Major at King's Norton in 1903, both of which he conducted. His peals were rung for 32 associations and guilds, in 521 towers, in 51 counties, and with 1036 ringers. At the funeral at Aldborough Hatch, near Ilford, on March 16th, the Association was represented by several of its officers and members; the Central Council was represented by the President (Mr. E. H. Lewis) and the Hon. Sec. (Mr. G. W. Fletcher). Many other ringing societies were officially represented, and amongst the large number of floral tributes was a beautiful wreath from this Association.

CHARLES H. ROSS, of St. Mary's, Hornsey. Died on August 23rd at the age of 67. A great loss to the Hornsey belfry, with which he had been connected for 37 years. He first joined the Association in 1910, and rang in four peals, two of which he conducted.

ALFRED J. TRAPPITT, of Beddington. Died on May 25th as a result of a motor-cycle accident. He was 57 years of age. He was a very safe ringer on all numbers of bells. He joined the Association in 1913, when a member of the Barnet band, and rang in eight peals with us, conducting one of them.

JESSE B. TYLER, of Clapton. Died on September 24th at the age of 51. He had been employed as a bell-hanger at the White-chapel foundry for the last 15 years. He joined the Association in 1919, on the occasion of his only peal with us.



CENTRAL COUNCIL NEWS.

THE 43rd Annual Meeting of the Council was held at Shrewsbury on Whit-Tuesday. This Association was represented by three of its four members. Messrs. J. A. Trollope and E. C. S. Turner, honorary members of the Council, were also present.

The Council was welcomed by the Lord Bishop of Lichfield on behalf of the Diocese. He said he was requested by the Lady Mayor of Shrewsbury to welcome the Council on her behalf.

A telegram was sent to the King offering respectful congratulations on the occasion of the Silver Jubilee, and later in the day a message of thanks was received from His Majesty.

The reports of the various Committees were discussed.

The following resolutions were adopted by the Council:—

1.—“That an address be presented by the Council to the diocesan Bishops, requesting them to take measures to ensure that the designs prepared for churches to serve new centres of population shall include due provision for the ultimate erection of substantial towers to accommodate peals of bells properly hung for ringing, at such points as to place every group of houses within hearing of a peal of bells; at the same time directing their Lordships' attention to the fact that all cause of annoyance from the sound of bells can be effectually eliminated, if architects' designs conform to the recommendations of the Tower and Belfries Committee.”

2.—“That in the opinion of the Council it is desirable that a record should be made of old peal boards, tablets, or otherwise, in the Church towers in the country.”

3.—“That to ensure the accuracy of the Council's peals analysis and as a matter of general interest, those responsible for sending the reports of peals for publication in the ringing press are urged to denote all 'first peals' and 'first peals in the method' both by any of the ringers and 'as conductor'.”

4.—“That a record be prepared of past members of the Council giving a short account of their work, and, where possible, a photograph, and that a committee be appointed to undertake this work.”

During the day the Council welcomed the Australian tourists, who brought messages of greetings from ringers in Australia and New Zealand.

After the meeting the members and friends were entertained by the Shropshire Association.
