Sir John Weld, of Arnold's Park, Southgate, obtained permission to build a "chapel of ease" in Waterfall Lane in 1615 and this building was demolished by October 1863. The one bell from the Weld Chapel was installed in the new tower of Christ Church. Peal ringing was at its peak in the 1890s and the early part of this century. *Ringing world* June 14<sup>th</sup> 1974 p. 485-6.

When Christ Church was dedicated in 1862 it possessed only one bell, a small one which had formerly hung in the Weld Chapel. Cast at Whitechapel and bears the date 1616. The back six of the present ring of ten were cast at Whitechapel and were rung for the first time on Whit Sunday 1874. In 1879 enough money was raised to augment the ring to 8 and in 1920 two more bells were added. *Ringing world* March 1st 1963 p. 143.

Original and lower frame designed to carry eight bells on one level. In 1920 upper framework of cast iron and steel for bells no. 1 and 4 above the eight bells. Tower manly of brick construction and stands over main entrance porch-way on the north side of the nave towards the west end. Stone spiral staircase to ringing room. Tower is capped with a hollow spire. From Whitechapel Bell Foundry records.

Public subscriptions and private donations enabled the back six of the present ten to be cast at Whitechapel and they were rung for the first time on Whit Sunday, 1874. In 1879 further subscriptions raised enough money to augment the ring to eight and finally in 1920 two more bells were added – the gift of the Barker family, of Southgate. The first peal on the bells was rung on April 21<sup>st</sup> 1880. *Ringing world* March 1 1963, p. 143
