## RULES.

1.—The Association shall be called "The Middlesex County Association and London Diocesan Guild of Change-Ringers." For the purpose of administration it shall be divided into two districts, to be known as the North and East District, and the South and West District.

2.—The objects of the Association are (1) the recognition of the true position of ringers as church workers; (2) the due care and use of church bells and belfries; and (3) the promotion and advancement of the art of change-ringing.

3.—The Association shall consist of honorary and ringing members. Honorary members shall subscribe not less than 5s. annually, or by a donation of not less than £1 1s. become life-members. Such members may be admitted at any time. Ringing members shall pay an annual subscription of 1s. 6d., and all subscriptions shall become due on January 1st in each year. A life subscription of 5s. may, however, be accepted from non-resident members in lieu of the annual payment of 1s. 6d. Life members coming to reside within the area of the Association shall pay an annual subscription of 1s. 6d. except during the first two years after the payment of the life subscription of 5s. Such members may, on leaving the area of the Association, revert to the status of life-members if they so desire. Members shall be deemed to have withdrawn from the Association if their subscriptions become more than one year in arrear.

4.—The government of the Association shall be vested in a committee (hereinafter referred to as the Central Committee) consisting of the following members, of whom five shall form a quorum, viz.:—

- (a) The President, Active Vice-Presidents, Master, Secretary, Treasurer, one of the Trustees, and the Representatives on the Central Council of Church Bell-Ringers.
- (b) The District Masters and Secretaries, and their Deputies.
- (c) Three members elected by each district.

The President, Active Vice-Presidents, Master, Secretary, Treasurer, and three Trustees, shall be elected annually at the annual general meeting. The District Masters and Secretaries and their Deputies, and the three members of each district, shall be elected annually at the annual meeting of their district.

5.—There shall be a committee in each district, consisting of the following members of whom five shall form a quorum, viz.:—

- (a) The representatives of the district on the Central Committee, and (b) one representative from each tower in the district having members in the Association.

These committees shall meet from time to time for the purpose of transacting any business of the district not provided for in the rules of the Association.

6.—The annual general meeting of the Association shall be held on a Saturday, as soon as possible after Easter, for the purpose of electing officers, transacting business, and for united practice in change-ringing. At such meeting the annual report and statement of accounts shall be presented, and the place of the next annual general meeting fixed. Other general meetings may be arranged by the Central Committee.

7.—Each district shall hold a meeting not later than the second Saturday in February in each year for the election of its officers and representatives on the Central Committee. It shall manage the business of the district, collect subscriptions, and publish its separate statement of accounts.

8.—Members may be elected at any general or district meeting, on the proposition of two members. Members may also be provisionally elected previous to a peal attempt on the proposition of two members, provided that not less than half the band are already members. Any such election must be confirmed at the next meeting of the district in which the provisional election takes place, and the subscription must be paid not later than the date of this meeting.

9.—The Central Committee shall have power to suspend any member who conducts himself in a manner likely to bring discredit upon the Association. Any such suspension shall be reported at the next general meeting of the Association, when the suspended member may be dismissed and shall forfeit any payment that he may have made to the Association.

10.—The Secretary of each district shall remit to the Treasurer of the Association the balance of the subscriptions received by him after payment of the normal running expenses of his district.

11.—The Treasurer is authorised to pay out of the funds of the Association the following:—

- (a) The expenses of the annual general meeting.
- (b) The travelling expenses of the Central Committee.
- (c) The cost of printing the Annual Report.
- (d) Postages, stationery, and other incidental expenses.
- (e) The fee due to the Central Council of Church Bell-Ringers.
- (f) The expenses of Representatives on the Central Council of Church Bell-Ringers.

12.—The Central Committee shall be empowered to authorise any expenditure not provided for in rules 11 and 14.

13.—Each band of ringers in the Association shall appoint a local secretary, who shall collect the subscriptions of his band, and with whom the District Secretaries shall correspond.

14.—District Secretaries are authorised so far as funds permit, to pay the expenses of an instructor for any band in the Association, should such be applied for.

15.—The District Secretaries shall satisfy themselves, by personal inspection or otherwise, as to the state of belfries and bands in their districts, and make a yearly report to the Central Committee.

16.—The conductor of any peal rung for the Association shall forward the composition to the Secretary within one month of the date on which it is rung, unless such composition is apparent from the report published in the ringing paper for the time being in circulation.

17.—The Association shall be affiliated to the Central Council of Church Bell Ringers, and shall loyally abide by the rules and decisions thereof. Representatives shall be elected in accordance with the rules of the Council.

18.—No alteration in or addition to these rules shall be made except at an annual general or special meeting of the Association, and notice of any proposed addition or alteration must be sent to the Secretary in writing at least 21 days before one of such meetings.

*NOTICE.—The Central Committee will be happy to assist the Clergy in framing Rules for the proper management of their Ringers and Belfries.*

THE 41st Annual General Meeting was held at St. John's Church, Hillingdon, on Saturday, April 30th, 1938. Some 80 members, including most of the officers of the Association, attended. The usual service was supported by a large congregation, to whom the Vicar (Rev. A. M. Bashford) preached a very appropriate sermon for a ringers' gathering.

The business meeting was held under the chairmanship of the President. After the opening formalities, the new draft rules were submitted, and following some discussion, they were adopted. These new rules are printed in this report. They should be carefully studied by all members, for it is only by loyally carrying out the rules of the Association that we may assist in promoting its prosperity. It is particularly important that rules 3, 8 and 13 be adhered to; by which all of us may help our hard-worked district secretaries. Rule 16 is of importance to conductors of peals, and it is sincerely hoped that those responsible will carry it out.

Other business transacted at the meeting included the election of officers, when Mr. W. H. Oram was elected hon. treasurer, which office was vacant through the death of Mr. W. H. Hollier. The other officers were re-elected, with the exception of Mr. F. W. Goodfellow, who retired from the office of joint hon. secretary. This position, under the new rules, became non-existent, and Mr. C. T. Coles was elected as hon. general secretary of the Association. Later in the meeting, Mr. Goodfellow was unanimously elected an honorary life member in recognition of his services as secretary of the South and West District and joint secretary of the Association for seven years. He was also elected as Central Council representative for one year in place of the late Mr. Hollier.

It is with some satisfaction that we note a considerable improvement in the attendances at meetings in both districts. In the North and East District, meetings were held at Clerkenwell, Bethnal Green, Monken Hadley, Stanmore, Northaw, Pinner, Upper Clapton, and Southgate, with attendances averaging 43—much better than in 1937. The usual joint meeting with the Hertfordshire Association took place at North Mimms on July 23rd, whilst on October 1st a highly successful meeting was held at Shoreditch in conjunction with the Society of Royal Cumberland Youths and the Essex Association, when some 80 ringers attended. This is the first occasion on which we have co-operated in this way with one of the two oldest of the London societies, and the success of the meeting gives us much hope for the future.

Several successful meetings were held in the South and West District, the attendances, which averaged 42, being much better than in the previous year. These meetings were held at Heston, Ealing

(Christ Church and St. Mary's), Chiswick, Sunbury, Acton, Hillingdon (St. John's) and Twickenham. The Acton meeting was held by special request of the Rector (Rev. P. Gough), who entertained members to tea. The Hillingdon meeting was, as usual, a joint affair with the Ladies' Guild and the Oxford Diocesan Guild, whilst the London County Association was invited to the Chiswick meeting. Two other joint meetings were held, one at Egham and neighbouring towers on August 27th, with the Guildford Diocesan Guild and the Surrey Association, with an attendance of nearly 80, and the other at Kingston-on-Thames on October 8th, when about 60 members of our own society and the Surrey Association attended.

A series of practices were arranged during the winter at St. Giles, Cripplegate, with varying results. It is regretted that only a few members regularly attended these practices.

The supper held in the South and West District continues to be well supported. That held at Heston on January 22nd last year was attended by some 80 members and friends.

Whilst the increased support given to meetings causes us some satisfaction, there is still considerable room for improvement. Too often it is only the "regulars" that attend, and it is quite apparent that some members never take that trouble. We repeat what we said last year, "If every member made a point of attending at least one meeting per year, what a difference it would make—especially to their own ringing!"

Our membership again shows a decrease. We regret that three members have been lost by death; whilst again a large number have had to be deleted from the books through non-payment of subscriptions. Most of these occur in the S. & W. District, but as the balance sheet of that district actually shows an increase in income it is to be hoped that we have reached the stage when no further deletions need be made. Only by a great effort, however, on the part of all members, can this district again attain its former prosperity.

The number of new members elected during the year was two honorary and 58 ringing members, and the total on the books at the end of the year was 856.

We are glad to report some progress at St. Matthew's, Upper Clapton, where an entirely new band has been formed, which is receiving instruction from Mr. G. A. Parsons. There has also been a considerable acquisition of members at Edmonton and Enfield (St. Mary's). Several members of the St. Dunstan's, Stepney, band have joined us, and we give these talented ringers a sincere and hearty welcome to the Association.

During 1938 we rang exactly 50 peals, an increase of 15 on the previous year. Of these, four were rung on handbells, and 46 on tower bells in 28 different towers. Eight members rang their first peals; four their first handbell peals; 68 their first peals in a new method, or on a different number of bells; whilst 142 members in

all took part in the peals. There were 17 conductors. Members ringing their first peals were Miss G. Alleway (Stanmore) and Messrs. A. J. Howell (Bethnal Green), D. J. Bowen (Kingsbury), E. W. Fulford and T. J. Thurley (Chiswick), F. Miller (St. Mary's, Ealing), H. G. Andrews (Ealing, Christ Church) and H. S. T. Willson (St. Olaves, Hart Street). Mr. J. W. Humphries (Kingsbury) rang his first tower bell peal, whilst Mr. E. J. Leversuch (Stanmore) rang his first peal as conductor.

Peals calling for special mention include Spliced Surprise Major in nine methods rung at Willesden on April 5th, conducted by Mr. E. C. S. Turner; Cranbourne Surprise Major rung at Egham on June 16th, and Ashbourne College Bob Major rung at Staines (St. Mary's) on July 6th, both conducted by Mr. A. R. Pink; and Isleworth Bob Royal rung at Isleworth on November 12th, conducted by Mr. Turner. The peals of Cranbourne, Ashbourne, and Isleworth were the first ever rung in these methods.

There was a slight increase in the quarter-peals rung, but further improvement is still possible. The Southgate band again head the list, both in numbers and in variety of methods, all these quarter-peals being rung for Sunday services. The Heston band, too, have done very well with twelve quarter-peals.

Two important bell restorations are reported. At St. George-in-the-East one bell, the 6th, was recast, the others were sand-blasted and retuned, all being rehung in strengthened oak framework with completely new fittings. This work was carried out by Messrs. Mears and Stainbank. The peal of eight at St. Giles-in-the-Fields was rehung in ball bearings by Messrs. J. Taylor & Co.

We regret losing the valuable services of Mr. G. R. Goodship, who has left the county for business reasons. After a period of nine years as assistant hon. secretary, he became hon. secretary of the North and East District last year. He also did very good work at Harrow Weald, where he formed and taught a new band with much success. It was mainly through his efforts that the peal at that church was augmented to eight a few years ago. We desire to place on record our sincere appreciation of his services to the Association, and wish him success in his new career.

The vacancy caused by the resignation of Mr. Goodship was filled for a few months by Mr. C. T. Coles, until the recent annual meeting of the district concerned, when Mr. T. J. Lock was elected hon. secretary. Mr. Lock, whose marriage to Miss K. M. Bradford in April last was the social event of the year, has our sincere good wishes, both for his domestic happiness and for his success in his new office.

Other changes in district officers include the election of Messrs. A. Cutler (Willesden) and W. H. Coles (Hillingdon) as masters of the North and East and the South and West Districts respectively, and they, too, have our good wishes.

We desire to offer our hearty congratulations to one of our

honorary members, Sir G. G. Craig, a churchwarden at St. John's, Hillingdon, on having received a Knighthood from His Majesty.

Two of our members at Hillingdon, Messrs. W. Honor and J. J. Pratt, completed their 50th year as ringers at St. John's Church. Both were honoured in October, when suitable presentations were made on behalf of the ringers and congregation.

Mr. J. H. Hunnisett, of St. Mary's, Ealing, where he was for many years leader of the band, has left the district for Eastbourne, on his retirement. He will be greatly missed at the tower in which he did much good work, and he takes with him the good wishes of us all.

As stated at the commencement of this report, the new rules are now in operation. One effect of them is to abolish the office of district treasurer, and we cannot let the occasion pass without sincerely thanking Messrs. T. Collins and W. H. Oram for their services in conserving our funds as well as they have done. Mr. Oram's valuable services are, fortunately, retained as treasurer of the Association, whilst Mr. Collins represents his district on the Central Committee.

We have again to express our indebtedness to Mr. C. T. Coles for his services as honorary secretary. Mr. Coles' long term of office must in the nature of things be drawing to its close, but we hope to keep him for some time yet. The success of the Association has depended very much on the work he has done for us, and its continuance depends largely on our finding a successor who will carry on the work in the same spirit.

### In Memoriam

Members lost to us by death during 1938.

**WALTER P. CROSS**, Windsor.—Died on February 27th, at the age of 51. He learned to ring at Farnham Royal, being a pupil of the late Joseph J. Parker. He had been a member of this Association since 1924, and rang in two peals with us.

**GEORGE T. DALTRY**, Bristol.—Died on June 8th, at an advanced age. He had been a ringer at All Saints' Church, Bristol, for over 50 years. He joined this Association in 1903, when on a visit to London, and rang in two peals.

**ALBERT RILEY**, Islington.—Died on July 16th, after a long and painful illness, patiently borne. He was for many years a ringer at St. James, Islington, and afterwards at St. Mary's, Islington. Later he became towerkeeper at St. John of Jerusalem, South Hackney. He was a member of this Association since 1905, and rang in one peal.

## CENTRAL COUNCIL NEWS

THE 46th Annual Meeting of the Central Council was held in the Civil Court of Leeds Town Hall on Whit-Tuesday, June 7th, under the chairmanship of the President (Mr. E. H. Lewis). There were 92 members of the Council present, this Association being fully represented.

Reference was made to the loss, by death, of five members, including Mr. W. H. Hollier, who since 1924 had represented this Association on the Council, during which time he attended 14 meetings.

During the discussion of the librarian's report it was stated that the "Model Rules" were out of stock. They would be revised by a sub-committee and afterwards printed. The book on the preservation of bells would also be revised and reprinted. The stock of "Hints to Conductors and Beginners" would shortly be replenished.

The Methods Committee reported that the third edition of Doubles and Minor methods would be on sale shortly.

To enable the Council to meet the cost of printing the book on Surprise Major methods, the Standing Committee recommended that affiliated societies be invited to take up one half of the issue. This was agreed to by the Council.

A report was submitted by the officers of the Council on the muffling of bells. After a discussion it was decided that the report should be redrafted to incorporate certain matters raised, and after approval by the Standing Committee it would be sent to the Church authorities.

The following motion was proposed by Mr. J. S. Goldsmith, seconded by Mr. W. G. Wilson, and carried:—

"This Council, desiring that peals of Doubles and Minor shall be put on a similar basis, resolves that peals of Doubles as already defined may be lengthened at the end by one true touch of less than 120 changes."

The 1939 meeting of the Council will be held in London.
