HOUNSLOW

The tower is of brick construction at the west end of the south aisle. A spiral staircase leads to the small ringing chamber with medium draft.

Eight bells with timber headstocks, plain bearings, ironwork. The wheels are of oak. The bell ropes are out of plumb and come to the ringing room via an intermediate chamber aided by timber chutes. The bell frame is of standard design made of oak. The frame, supported on four foundation beams, is not tie-bolted. Chiming mechanism. From Inspection Report by the Whitechapel Bell foundry dated 1959

The bells are rung in full circle.
