

CITY, ST PAUL'S Mostly dictated by Steve 11.11.2004

Entry to the tower is at the north-west end of the Cathedral built The bells are rung from the second floor. Access by small door on the north side of the Cathedral. A wide spiral stone clockwise staircase up to the first floor, a passage along the north-east corner wall of the tower, alongside the St' Paul's Guild Library and Meeting Room. Another short spiral staircase which takes you into the very tall ringing room of approximately 40 ft. and every one of the twelve bells are rung from a box, there are no rope guides. Instead of the records of the peals rung are The peals painted directly on to the walls which is unique. The staircase from the ground floor continues by means for access to the belfry. The twelve bells are hung on ball bearings on one level.
