The tower is at the west end of the church. There is one peal board displayed in the west porch. Access to the ringing room is via a stone spiral staircase located in the north-east corner of the tower. This medium size room with the ceiling of c.18 ft in height has one stained glass window and one clock hammer. The chiming apparatus was installed in 1880 but dismantled in 1979 when the new ringing floor was installed. This area used to be open to the main body of the church but is now sealed off with glass screen.

The continuation of the staircase leads to the belfry. The bells are hung in a steel 'H' frame on one level and all the bells have wooden headstocks. (VP: One source says 'H' frame and another says 'A', which is it to be?)

The south and west facing louvres are shuttered for sound control.

The bells retain their canons with the exception of the tenor which is through-bolted, and hang in an 'A' frame.

The treble is chimed as the Sanctus bell. The bells are rung in full circle.
