

EDGWARE. Sources

St Margaret Edgware. West tower, 14th century, rebuilt 1764? Bells: six, 1769. LMAS *Transactions* vol. 18: *Middlesex churches*

"Thomas Janaway also cast the six at Edgware". F. W. M. Draper: The bells of Middlesex – Hornsey bells. LMAS *Transactions* vol.10

The church bells of Middlesex. H. B. Walters LMAS *Transactions* vol. 11. Gives details and information on the bells but gives the dedication as **St Mary** Edgware.

Maiden ring by Thomas Janaway cast in the churchyard in 1769. 6 bells with tenor 3' 0" diameter and 8 $\frac{3}{4}$ cwt. Wood frame on one tier. No peal boards but inscriptions on all bells and details deposited in Library. Discrepancies between Form and details from LMAS Transactions. Mr M Ellis requested to check March 1987. VP notes.

A 15th century west tower of Kentish rag and Reigate dressings with diagonal buttresses and a north east turret, higher than the battlemented parapet. Pevsner *Middlesex*

Saturday May 2nd 1903 5040 Minor in 2h 43m. Richard Bevan, Mark Woodcock, Frank Smith, James Durrant, Francis Carroway, C H Martin (conductor). The first 5040 on the bells since they have been rehung by Messrs Barwell. Peal board?
