## RULES.

I.—The Association shall be called "The Middlesex County Association and London Diocesan Guild of Change-Ringers." It was formed on June 7th, 1897, by a union of the Middlesex Association and the South and West Middlesex Guild, and these Societies are hereinafter known as the North and East, and South and West Districts of the County Association.

II.—Its objects are (1) the recognition of the true position of Ringers as Church Officials; (2) the due care and use of Church Bells and Belfries; and (3) the cultivation of the art of Change-Ringing.

III.—The government of the Association shall be vested in a Committee (hereinafter referred to as the Central Committee) consisting of the following members, of whom five shall form a quorum, viz:—

- (a) The Bishop of the Diocese, who, being a member, shall be ex-Officio Patron of the Association.
- (b) The President, Master, Secretaries and Treasurer of the Association.
- (c) The Vice-Presidents, Masters, Treasurers and Secretaries of each District of the Association.
- (d) Three members elected annually by each District, as hereinafter provided. The President, Master, Secretary and Treasurer of the Association shall retire annually at the Annual General Meeting, but shall be eligible for re-election, provided always that the District Secretaries for the time being may, if thought fit, be at the same time Joint Secretaries of the Association.

IV.—The Association shall consist of Honorary and Ringing Members. Honorary Members shall subscribe not less than 5s. annually, or by a donation of not less than £1 1s. become Life Members. Such Members may be admitted by the Secretaries at any time. Ringing Members shall pay an Annual Subscription of 1s. 6d., and all subscriptions shall become due on January 1st in each year. A Life Subscription of 5s. may, however, be accepted from non-resident Members in lieu of the annual payment of 1s. 6d.

V.—The following expenses shall be paid by the Treasurer of the Association out of the moneys to be remitted to him by the Treasurer of each District, as hereinafter provided, viz:—

- (a) The expenses of the Annual Meeting.
- (b) The fees and expenses of representatives of the Central Council.
- (c) The travelling expenses of the Central Committee.
- (d) The cost of printing the Annual Report.
- (e) Postage, Stationery, and other incidental expenses.

VI.—No person shall be admitted as a Ringing Member if he belongs to a band, till he be certified by the captain of his band to be a change-ringer or desirous of learning change-ringing—or if he does not belong to a band, till he be recommended to the Central Committee by two Ringing Members of the Association; but any person duly certified or recommended as aforesaid, shall be admitted as a Ringing Member at any General or District Meeting of the Association.

VII.—The Annual General Meeting of the Association shall be held on the Saturday in Easter week, for the purpose of electing officers, transacting business, and for united practice in change-ringing. At such Meeting a report of proceedings and a statement of accounts shall be presented, and the place of the next Annual General Meeting fixed. All other General Meetings may be arranged by the Central Committee, and the times and places of ensuing District Meetings shall be arranged by the District Secretaries, as empowered by a majority of Members present at the last District Meeting held.

VIII.—That any person wishing to attempt a peal may be proposed, seconded and elected in the tower, provided there be a majority of members present. The conductor of the peal shall be responsible for collecting the subscription of the newly-elected member previously to the attempt being made, and shall at once report the election to the Secretary in whose District the peal is attempted, in order that the same may be ratified at the next District Meeting.

IX.—Members whose subscriptions are more than one year in arrear, shall be deemed to have withdrawn from the Association.

X.—The chief endeavour of the Association being to instil greater reverence for God's House and worship among its members, any member misconducting himself may be dismissed at the discretion of the Central Committee, who shall report the same to the Annual General Meeting, and, in the event of his dismissal, such member shall forfeit any payment which he may have made to the Association.

XI.—That this Association be affiliated to the Central Council of Church Bell Ringers, and loyally abide by the Rules and Decisions thereof.

XII.—No alteration in or addition to these Rules shall be made except at an Annual General or Special Meeting of the Association, and notice of any proposed addition or alteration, or of any motion relating to any other matter in connection with the Association, must be sent in handwriting at least twenty-one days before one of such meetings.

*NOTICE.—The Central Committee will be happy to assist the Clergy in framing Rules for the proper management of their Ringers and Belfries.*

## RULES FOR THE DISTRICT SOCIETIES.

I.—Each District Society shall hold a meeting not later than the second Saturday in February in each year for the election of its Officers and representatives on the Central Committee of the Association, and shall be at liberty to manage its own business, collect its own subscriptions, and publish its separate Balance Sheets.

II.—The District Secretaries shall receive all subscriptions in their Districts, and remit them to the Treasurer. They shall also satisfy themselves, by personal inspection or otherwise, as to the state of Belfries and Bands in their Districts, and make a yearly report for presentation to the Central Committee.

III.—The Treasurer of each District shall remit to the Treasurer of the Association 60 per cent. of the subscriptions received by him from his District Secretary, the remainder of such subscriptions being retained by the District for its own use.

IV.—Each band of Ringers in the Association shall appoint a Local Secretary, who shall collect the subscriptions, and with whom the General Secretaries shall correspond.

V.—There shall be a Committee in each District, consisting of (a) the representatives of the District on the Central Committee of the Association, and (b) one representative from each tower in the District in union with the Association. These Committees shall meet from time to time for the transaction of any business affecting the District not provided for in the foregoing Rules.

VI.—Bands desirous of employing an instructor should apply to one or other of the District Secretaries, who will endeavour, so far as funds permit, to meet their wishes.

## REPORT, 1931.

**T**HE most important event of the year, from a purely Association point of view, was the augmenting of the bells at Isleworth to a peal of ten, and it was not surprising that the re-opening service on June 13th was attended by a large congregation of members. The Lord Bishop of Kensington, whom we wish a speedy recovery from the illness which he contracted late in the autumn, dedicated the two new trebles, and afterwards gave us a very interesting and useful sermon. The two new bells, which were cast at the Whitechapel foundry, are fitting companions to the original octave, and the whole of the work has been done well. The conception of the scheme to place these bells in the tower was due to Mr. W. H. Hollier, who, in spite of many discouragements, persevered until the necessary money was raised and the work completed. A board now hangs in the Church recording that the two smallest bells in the tower were erected by members of this Association, generously assisted by parishioners and friends. It also records the date and details of the dedication service, as well as the names of the persons responsible for the carrying out of the augmentation. The board was the gift of Mr. Hollier, to whom our best thanks are due for his untiring efforts to bring this work to a successful conclusion.

The Association's memorial to the late President, which has been erected in the belfry of Barnet Church, was unveiled and dedicated on October 10th by the Rector of Barnet, the Rev. W. E. Moll. The memorial, which is of white marble on a black marble base, records the last peal in which Mr. Milne took part, one of Grandsire Triples rung on February 4th, 1922, exactly eight years before his death. The tablet also contains the following inscription:—

"To the Glory of God and in grateful memory of Frank Alexander Milne, M.A., J.P., President of this Association, the members have erected this tablet recording the last peal in which he took part. He died, at the age of 75, on February 5th, 1930."

'The memory of the just is Blessed.'

Proverbs x, 7.

The year 1931 also saw the erection of a memorial to Fabian Stedman, who nearly 300 years ago first rang the method which bears his name, and which has given so much pleasure to change-ringers. The six bells at St. Benedict's Church, Cambridge, on

which Fabian Stedman used to ring, have been restored and rehung by Messrs. John Taylor & Co., of Loughborough, the cost of the work being borne by ringers all over the country. This Association was one of the first to contribute to the fund, and it was a source of gratification to us that Mr. Wm. Pye, our worthy Ringing Master, was chosen as one of the band to ring the first six-score of Stedman Doubles on the bells immediately after the dedication ceremony on December 5th. Several other officers, as well as a number of members, also represented the Association at Cambridge on that great occasion.

The 34th Annual Meeting was held on Saturday, April 11th, at St. James' Church, Clerkenwell. Besides the transaction of the usual routine business a new rule was adopted, affiliating the Association to the Central Council and binding the Guild to abide by the rules and decisions of that body. In connection with the Stedman Memorial, referred to above, the sum of £5 was voted as the Association's contribution. Upwards of 80 members attended the meeting, and with the bells at St. Sepulchre's, Holborn, and St. Giles', Cripplegate, available for ringing, some good practice on ten and twelve bells was obtained.

Meetings were held by the N. and E. District at St. Giles-in-the-Fields, Dalston, Pinner, Stanmore, Hendon, Barnet and Hornsey, the attendances averaging 50, whilst a mid-week evening meeting was held at St. Augustine's, Kilburn, on Thursday, February 12th. Joint Meetings with the Hertford and Essex Associations were held at Barnet and Walthamstow (St. Mary's) with excellent results in each case.

Meetings in the S. and W. District were held at Isleworth, Ealing (St. Mary's), Heston, Ruislip, Staines (St. Peter's), Acton, Hillingdon (St. John's), Ealing (Christ Church) and Feltham, with an average attendance of 34. The special meeting to re-open the bells at Isleworth has already been referred to at some length.

The number of members elected during the year were 2 Honorary and 53 Ringing members, about equally divided between the two districts. We are pleased to record the re-affiliation of the band at St. Catherine's, Feltham, and trust that they will long remain of service to the Association. On the other hand, we regret that the ringers at St. Mary's, Norwood Green, have lapsed from membership.

In spite of the satisfactory number of new members, there is a slight falling off in the total membership, which now stands at 858. Most of the lapses are due to non-payment of subscriptions, doubtless due in quite a number of cases to lack of enthusiasm. In connection with the difficulties experienced by those in charge of bands we venture to make a few suggestions as to the best means of instilling sufficient interest in young ringers to cause them to remain members of the band until such time as their proficiency in ringing itself will be enough incentive. Each band of ringers should be formed into a proper Guild, with

the Vicar or Rector of the parish as one of the chief officers. At least one business meeting of the Guild should be held every year, when the year's work could be reviewed. The social side of ringing might be cultivated much more than it is at present, and it will be found that an annual outing is a great urge to loyalty, and an incentive to progress. The same might be said of an annual supper, which is already one of the chief events of the year in some of our most successful local guilds. Much more use might be made of handbells, both with change-ringing and tune playing, and a peal of handbells should be in the possession of every band. At times when the Church bells cannot be rung, the handbells might be the means of keeping the band together when it would otherwise drift apart for lack of opportunity of meeting.

The peals rung during the year numbered 76, of which all but two were rung on tower bells at 32 different Churches. Two handbell peals were accomplished. The detailed list is shewn elsewhere, an examination of which will shew that eleven members rang their first peals, and 97 their first peals in a new method, or on a different number of bells. Many members rang their first peals in the higher Surprise methods, including four of London, four of Bristol, six of Cambridge Royal, two of Cambridge Maximus, and two of Spliced Surprise Major in four methods. Two members rang their first peals of Stedman Cinques. Special mention must be made of the first peal rung by Mr. George B. Collins, of St. Andrew's, Enfield, who accomplished a peal of Bob Royal on handbells, doublehanded, on July 9th! There were 23 conductors, whilst 145 members took part in the peals.

Amongst the peals themselves were several fine performances. On January 17th, the first peal of Yorkshire Surprise Maximus rung in London was accomplished at Southwark Cathedral, conducted by Mr. W. Pye. The first peal of Yorkshire Surprise Royal rung by the Association was conducted by Mr. W. H. Hewett, at St. Margaret's, Westminster, on January 30th. A peal in twelve Surprise Major methods, spliced, was rung at St. Mary's, Ealing, on July 1st, by the band that had previously rung peals in five, six, ten and eleven Surprise methods. Later in the year this band rang a 5760 in nine Surprise Major methods, this being the extent on the plan and a record number of changes. This peal was rung at Willesden on December 1st, and, like the twelve method peal, was conducted by Mr. W. Pye. The first peal of Spliced Surprise Royal ever rung was also conducted by Mr. Pye at St. Magnus-the-Martyr, Thames Street, on July 25th, this being in three methods. The first peal on the ten bells at Isleworth was one of Grandsire Caters, rung by a band of officers of the Association on June 27th. Two peals were rung in honour of the birthday of H.M. the King, whilst four were rung in connection with the Stedman Tercentenary celebrations. A peal of Bob Major was rung on January 10th by a band of policemen, conducted by Inspector W. Bottrill.

Apart from the work at Isleworth there is little to report in the way of bell-restoration. The ten bells at St. Mary Abbots'

Kensington, have been generally overhauled by Messrs. Mears and Stainbank; whilst Messrs. Gillett and Johnston have carried out a general screwing up of frame and bearings at St. James', Clerkenwell. The ring of six at Finchley are now being rehung by the Croydon firm in a new metal frame constructed to carry eight bells. Through the generosity of C. E. Goddard, Esq., of Sunbury, the bells at that Church have been put in good order by Messrs. J. Taylor & Co., whose previous work in the same tower had stood the test of 30 year's wear.

We regret to record the death of our old friend, Mr. Tom Beadle, which took place on June 24th after a long illness. It was a strange coincidence that his passing away should occur only a few days after the re-opening of the Isleworth bells, and that the first peal on the ten bells should be his memorial peal. Practically the whole of his ringing career was connected with the Isleworth tower, and he was greatly responsible for the spread of change-ringing in West Middlesex over a generation ago. He was not only one of the founding members of this Association, but was a founder of the South and West Middlesex Association, which preceded it in that part of the county, and was one of the men actively responsible for the forming of the County Association by the amalgamating of the two district guilds. After being for many years Master of the S. and W. District, he became a Vice-President in 1920, holding that post for five years, when failing health caused his retirement. He will be especially remembered for his straightforwardness and integrity, and it may confidently be said of him that he died leaving behind him many friends, but no enemies.

The Association was honoured at the meeting of the Central Council at Liverpool in May last by the election of the youngest of its representatives as Hon. Sec. to the Council. We feel sure that Mr. G. W. Fletcher, who follows some famous men in an onerous and important post, will not only bring honour to the Council, but also to the Association of which he is a representative.

The impending retirement of Mr. W. H. Hollier from the position of Joint Hon. Secretary was foreshadowed by his resignation in February of this year, as Hon. Sec. of the S. and W. District. Mr. Hollier has served us faithfully and well since 1921, and deserves our sincere thanks for the immense amount of work he has done on behalf of the Association. The best way in which to shew our gratitude to Mr. Hollier, and we feel quite sure he will agree with us in this, is to give to his successor, Mr. F. W. Goodfellow, our loyal support at Association meetings, and in assisting him as much as lays in our power by prompt payment of subscriptions, and a special effort to increase the efficiency of ourselves and the particular band to which we belong.

## In Memoriam.

Members lost to us by death during 1931.

**THOMAS BEADLE.**—Died on June 24th, at the advanced age of 81. He was a founding member of the Association, and a ringer at Isleworth for over half a century. He was for many years Master, and afterwards Vice-President of the S. and W. District. His work for the Association is referred to in the report. A half-muffled peal was rung in his memory at Isleworth on June 27th. He rang in 59 Association peals.

**THOMAS T. GOFTON**, of Whitley Bay, Northumberland. Died, at the age of 56, on June 20th. He had been a member since 1924 and had rung in nine peals for the Association. He was a very reliable ringer, and did splendid work for the exercise in his own county. A half-muffled peal was rung on July 6th at St. Botolph's, Bishopsgate, in his memory.

**WILBY J. HAZELL.**—Died on January 19th at the age of 62. He joined the Association in 1908, as a member of the Edmonton band, and remained a regular and loyal member of that band until his death. He was an excellent striker and a reliable ringer in the higher surprise methods. His 76 Association peals included several on handbells.

**WILLIAM MILLER**, of Leytonstone. Died, age 63, on March 4th. He had been Master of the band at St. John's, Leytonstone for 33 years, and a member of this Association since 1900. He rang in 62 peals for this Association. On March 9th a half-muffled peal was rung in his memory at St. Botolph's, Bishopsgate.
