March 1954. St Anne Highgate. 8 bells rehung. Whitechapel Foundry day book 240/97.

Tuesday July 13<sup>th</sup> 1886. Muffled peal [I.e. whole pull & stand etc.] by Society of Royal Cumberland Youths to the late Henry Driver, who had been a scruffe ringer at this church for about 12 years. *Bell news & ringers' record* 17<sup>th</sup> July 1886 p. 125.

Eight bells, 15 cwt. in 1853. Bell founding from the Armada to the Great War.

Tuesday November 6<sup>th</sup> 1883. Society of Royal Cumberland Youths. Peal of Kent Treble Bob Major in 3h 3m to celebrate the 60<sup>th</sup> birthday of James Page. *Bell news & ringers' record* 10<sup>th</sup> November 1883 p. 378.

Built 1852-53. West tower & spire. Founded by Anne Barnett in memory of [her brother] Richard Barnett of Brookfield. Designed by Thomas Bellamy. B F L Clarke *Parish churches of London* p. 143., But see *Buildings of England: London 4: North* 1998 "By George Plunkett, a partner of Messrs Cubitt".

20/02/1854 Miss Angela Burdett Coutts for St Anne's Highgate. Tenor 14-2-3, 7<sup>th</sup> 9-2-6, 6<sup>th</sup> 7-3-11, 5<sup>th</sup> 6-2-13, 4<sup>th</sup> 6-1-0, 3<sup>rd</sup> 5-1-13, 2<sup>nd</sup> 4-2-23, Treble 4-1-16. A substantial frame of English oak. Whitechapel Foundry day book 68.

Inscription on tenor bell:

C & G Mears Founders London This peal of bells was presented by Angela Georgina Burdett Coutts To the Church of St Anne's Brookfield Highgate December 1853. [Unknown source but see LMAS entry]

A bell already there before the ring of 8. Church completed 1853 and the bell had already been bought. Church designed by Thomas Bellamy. *Ringing world* September 18<sup>th</sup> 1992 p. 912. Rev. David Cawley. VP: "Look out for WBF 1853 for single bell for T Bellamy- searched Jan 1847-1852: nothing for T. Bellamy"

On Thursday December 6<sup>th</sup> 1888, 10 members of the Royal Cumberlands Society met by invitation of Mr Chapman at the Roe Buck, Hampstead to celebrate the completion of a tablet recording the peal of Cambridge Surprise Major. The tablet is of marble in the shape of a bell made by Mr G Hannington of Highgate. *Bell news & ringers' record* December 8<sup>th</sup> 1888 p. 473.

Ringers were: James Page, Benjamin Foskett, George Newson ©, James Hannington, Thomas Titchener, Arthur Jacob, Edward Chapman and James Barrett. *Ibid* June 26<sup>th</sup> 1888 p. 186.
