No canons remain on any of this, the only 18th century ring cast by Patrick & Osborn that has survived in London or Middlesex. The bells are hung on ball bearings on one level in a low sided cast iron frame which was installed by John Taylor of Loughborough during the restoration in 1992.

The bells are rung in full circle.

Tower at the east end of the church. Access to the ringing room which is on the 1st floor above the altar is by a series of wooden staircases on the south side of the tower. The ringing room has a door on the north side of the tower which leads directly on to the roof.

Access to the bells is by a short stone spiral staircase in the north-east corner of the tower and that takes you up to the 2ⁿ^d floor where technically the bells are now in a new steel frame and the staircase continues up to the remains of the old iron frame which was left in situ.
