HOUNSLOW

The tower is of brick construction at the west end of the south aisle. A spiral staircase leads to the small ringing chamber with medium draught.

The order came from A R Pite, Bloomsbury Square for a single bell. Cast by Mears & Stainbank in 1874, it weighed 6cwt and 3lbs; six years later the present bells were cast with canons and hung on plain bearings on one level in an oak frame.

The Ancient Society of College Youths rang the opening peal on Thursday June 23rd 1881. Ten years later another peal was rung when on Saturday September 28th, 1907 the Middlesex County Association rang 5040 changes of Stedman Triples, Thurstans' Four-Part by:- Joseph J Parker, Joseph J Pratt, Henry C Chandler, Edward Harris, John Basden - conductor, Frederick G Goddard, Allen H Taber and George Spencer
