HAREFIELD

The 16th century large squat tower of flint and rubble displays parts refaced with 17th century brick and finished with brick battlements and stands at the west end of the north aisle of the church.

The original bells:-

Treble 4-2-11 by Lester & Pack, 1753, Whitechapel.

2nd 6-0-29 by Bryan Eldridge, 1629, Chertsey - Listed

Tenor 6-3-26 by Thomas Swain, 1772, Longford, when William Babb and John Ive were Churchwardens.

The present treble, 2^{nd} and the 3^{rd} bells were the gift of Miss Dora Harland, daughter of the Revd. A A Harland, Vicar here from 1870 to 1920.

The first peal was rung on April 22nd, 1967 of 5040 changes of Minor in two hours forty-five minutes by members of the Middlesex County Association as a compliment to Mr. F Adams, Churchwarden at this church for forty years.
