## RULES.

I.—The Association shall be called "THE MIDDLESEX COUNTY ASSOCIATION AND LONDON DIOCESAN GUILD OF CHANGE-RINGERS." It was formed on June 7th, 1897, by a union of the Middlesex Association and the South and West Middlesex Guild, and these Societies are hereinafter known as the North and East, and South and West Districts of the County Association.

II.—Its objects are (1) the recognition of the true position of Ringers as Church Officials; (2) the due care and use of Church Bells and Belfries; and (3) the cultivation of the Art of Change-Ringing.

III.—The government of the Association shall be vested in a Committee (hereinafter referred to as the Central Committee) consisting of the following members, of whom five shall form a quorum, viz. :—

- (a) The Bishop of the Diocese, who, being a member, shall be ex-Officio Patron of the Association.
- (b) The President, Master, Secretaries and Treasurer of the Association.
- (c) The Vice-Presidents, Masters, Treasurers and Secretaries of each District of the Association.
- (d) Three Members elected annually by each District, as hereinafter provided. The President, Master, Secretary and Treasurer of the Association shall retire annually at the Annual General Meeting, but shall be eligible for re-election, provided always that the District Secretaries for the time being may, if thought fit, be at the same time Joint Secretaries of the Association.

IV.—The Association shall consist of Honorary and Ringing Members. Honorary Members shall subscribe not less than 5s. annually, or by a donation of not less than £1 is. become Life Members. Such Members may be admitted by the Secretaries at any time. Ringing Members shall pay an Annual Subscription of 1s. 6d., and all subscriptions shall become due on January 1st in each year. A Life Subscription of 5s. may, however, be accepted from non-resident Members in lieu of the annual payment of 1s. 6d.

V.—The following expenses shall be paid by the Treasurer of the Association out of the moneys to be remitted to him by the Treasurer of each District, as hereinafter provided, viz. :—

- (a) The expenses of the Annual Meeting.
- (b) The fees and expenses of representatives of the Central Council.
- (c) The travelling expenses of the Central Committee.
- (d) The cost of printing the Annual Report.
- (e) Postage, Stationery, and other incidental expenses.

VI.—No person shall be admitted as a Ringing Member if he belongs to a band, till he be certified by the captain of his band to be a change-ringer or desirous of learning change-ringing—or if he does not belong to a band, till he be recommended to the Central Committee by two Ringing Members of the Association; but any person duly certified or recommended as aforesaid, shall be admitted as a Ringing Member at any General or District Meeting of the Association.

VII.—The Annual General Meeting of the Association shall be held on the Saturday in Easter week, for the purpose of electing officers, transacting business, and for united practice in change-ringing. At such Meeting a report of proceedings, and a statement of accounts shall be presented, and the place of the next Annual General Meeting fixed. All other General Meetings may be arranged by the Central Committee, and the times and places of ensuing District Meetings shall be arranged by the District Secretaries, as empowered by a majority of Members present at the last District Meeting held.

VIII.—That any person wishing to attempt a peal may be proposed, seconded and elected in the tower, provided there be a majority of members present. The conductor of the peal shall be responsible for collecting the subscription of the newly-elected member previously to the attempt being made, and shall at once report the election to the Secretary in whose District the peal is attempted, in order that the same may be ratified at the next District Meeting.

IX.—Members whose subscriptions are more than one year in arrear, shall be deemed to have withdrawn from the Association.

X.—The chief endeavour of the Association being to instil greater reverence for God's House and worship among its members, any member misconducting himself may be dismissed at the discretion of the Central Committee, who shall report the same to the Annual General Meeting, and, in the event of his dismissal, such member shall forfeit any payment which he may have made to the Association.

XI.—No alteration in or addition to these Rules shall be made except at an Annual General or Special Meeting of the Association, and notice of any proposed addition or alteration, or of any motion relating to any other matter in connection with the Association, must be sent in writing at least twenty-one days before one of such meetings.

*NOTICE.—The Central Committee will be happy to assist the Clergy in framing Rules for the proper management of their Ringers and Belfries.*

## RULES FOR THE DISTRICT SOCIETIES.

I.—Each District Society shall hold a meeting not later than the second Saturday in February in each year for the election of its Officers and representatives on the Central Committee of the Association, and shall be at liberty to manage its own business, collect its own subscriptions, and publish its separate Balance Sheets.

II.—The District Secretaries shall receive all subscriptions in their Districts, and remit them to the Treasurer. They shall also satisfy themselves, by personal inspection or otherwise, as to the state of Belfries and Bands in their Districts, and make a yearly report for presentation to the Central Committee.

III.—The Treasurer of each District shall remit to the Treasurer of the Association 60 per cent. of the subscriptions received by him from his District Secretary, the remainder of such subscriptions being retained by the District for its own use.

IV.—Each band of Ringers in the Association shall appoint a Local Secretary, who shall collect the subscriptions, and with whom the General Secretaries shall correspond.

V.—There shall be a Committee in each District, consisting of (a) the representatives of the District on the Central Committee of the Association, and (b) one representative from each tower in the District in union with the Association. These Committees shall meet from time to time for the transaction of any business affecting the District not provided for in the foregoing Rules.

VI.—Bands desirous of employing an instructor should apply to one or other of the District Secretaries, who will endeavour, so far as funds permit, to meet their wishes.

## REPORT, 1928.

A DECADE has passed since our bells rang out to herald the advent of peace, and it is now time for us to take stock of our progress during that period. The end of the war found us, like other Associations, with our local bands sadly depleted, and in some cases almost broken up. In addition, quite a number of those members who returned from active service took no further part in the ringing of our bells. However, the efforts required from those responsible for keeping the Association in an active state was forthcoming, and to-day it is true to say that our strength has never been so great, or our activities so wide. During the period under review our membership has increased by upwards of 100, notwithstanding that death has taken a heavy toll. There has been a considerable increase in the number of affiliated towers, and instruction has been given at different times to several of our bands. Much credit is due to those who have undertaken this work, as well as to those leaders of local societies who, by continuous exertion, have not allowed their bands to become depleted. During the last year or two a welcome sign has been the increasing interest shown in ringing by the younger generation, and at the last Annual Meeting this was especially noticed. The future of our Association is with these young men. Let us therefore continue our efforts to interest them in our art and in our Guild.

The 31st Annual General Meeting was held at Ealing on Saturday, April 14th, and for the first time since 1917 the attendance passed the century mark. The three Ealing towers were open for ringing during the afternoon and evening. The usual service was held in St. Mary's Church, the preacher being Canon G. F. Coleridge (President of the Central Council). A passage in a very striking sermon might well be repeated here. The preacher, referring to a previous large gathering of ringers at the Croydon Bell Foundry, spoke of the mighty 18½-ton bell which they saw that day. As he looked at that great bell the thought occurred to him of what would be the effect if some musician were to stand beneath it with a violin. He could strike many notes, and there would be no response whatever; but let him strike the exact note of that bell on his instrument, and that mighty mass of metal would vibrate with sound in response to the comparatively feeble one. So it was with them all. Over them was the blue vault of heaven, like some great

bell. They were puny creatures underneath it, striking their notes in their daily lives. When they struck the right note the whole heavens rang with praise, and the angels and archangels took up the strain. They might not be very beautiful in their voices; but they might be very beautiful in their lives. Whether in the ringing chamber, the workshop, or the home, let their lives sound out true and real and pure, so that the heavens might respond and the whole earth and firmament be filled with the praise and glory of God.

At the subsequent business meeting, the whole of the retiring officers were re-elected. A new feature was a discussion of the agenda of the year's Central Council meeting, which, by a new rule of the Council, was published earlier than had previously been the case.

During the year meetings were held at St. Giles-in-the-Fields, Hornsey, Hendon, Stanmore, Finchley, Tottenham, and Poplar in the N. and E. district; and at Isleworth, Chiswick, Feltham, Ruislip, Harlington, Hillingdon (St. John's), Heston, Hillingdon (St. Andrew's), and Staines (St. Peter's), in the S. and W. district. The attendances were again very satisfactory, averaging 35 and 41 in the respective districts. In addition, mid-week practice meetings were held at Hadley, Pinner, and Stamford Hill, which, judging by the support given to them, were much appreciated.

An invitation from the Guildford Diocesan Guild to our S. and W. district members to hold a joint meeting at Egham was accepted, and over sixty members of the two Guilds attended. The welcome given to us was whole-hearted, and we hope to be able to give our neighbours as good a reception when they pay us a return visit this year.

The N. & E. district responded to an invitation to visit Hertfordshire, and a meeting at North Mimms was a very happy affair. The usual joint meeting at Waltham Abbey was also held, when we met Essex and Hertfordshire ringers. The very large attendance included eight officers of the three societies represented.

The peals rung during the year numbered 69, two of which were rung on handbells and the remainder on tower-bells in 38 different towers. The conducting was shared by 16 of our members, whilst 163 took part in the peals. Ten members rang their first peals, and 81 their first peals in a new method. Quite a large number of members rang their first peals of Superlative and Cambridge Surprise Maximus, Cambridge Surprise Royal, and London and Bristol Surprise Major; and still more their initial peals of Stedman Caters and Triples. Miss E. E. Chapman rang her first peal of Surprise Maximus, whilst Miss F. E. Orr took part in the first peal of Yorkshire Surprise Major rung by the Association. To them, and to Mr. W. G. Wilson, who conducted his first peal, we extend our congratulations.

The Association attained the honour of ringing the first peal of Superlative Surprise Maximus in London, this being accomplished at Southwark Cathedral on January 14th. Peals of Yorkshire and Lincolnshire Surprise Major were rung by the Association for the first time, the latter peal being rung without any of the band having previously practised the method! Two peals of Spliced Surprise Major in four methods were conducted from non-observation bells by Messrs. William and George R. Pye, these being performances of outstanding merit. Five Surprise Major methods were rung in one peal for the first time on December 18th at Willesden, whilst an excellent performance was accomplished on handbells at Ealing on December 20th. Three of the peals were rung with half-muffled clappers in memory of the late C. I. Edwards, R. E. Holloway, and G. Paice, at Heston, Acton and Edmonton, respectively.

Although not appearing in our records, we must not omit to refer to Mr. James George's 1,000th peal, which was rung at Wolverhampton on October 6th. Mr. George has been a loyal member of this Association for some 30 years, and whilst congratulating him on his achievement, we must express our pleasure that a considerable number of his peals have been rung for this society.

Our quarter-peal list, which is shown elsewhere in this report, denotes progress in certain towers, but at the same time other towers which were at one time prominent in the list show a decline. Several 720's at six-bell towers are noted, and the Northaw band must be congratulated on having rung some 30 extents of Minor, including one of Spliced Oxford and Kent Treble Bob.

Our membership remains the same as last year. One honorary and 60 ringing members were elected, but there were a large number of lapses, whilst eight of our members were taken from us by death. In connection with the lapses of membership, most of which were caused by removals, members are reminded that the Central Council has formed a scheme for keeping in touch with ringers removing from one district to another. The scheme was outlined in "The Ringing World" of June 1st, 1928. Local secretaries should advise their district secretary of any removals, giving the new address. At the same time, when local secretaries are advised of removals into their district they should take every step possible to obtain the services of the ringer concerned.

Our usual summary of bell-restoration work is given herewith. Messrs. Mears and Stainbank have re-hung the peal of six at St. Ann's, Stamford Hill, in new bearings, and the eight bells at St. Mary's, Staines, in new fittings with strengthened framework. The bells at St. Paul's Cathedral have been overhauled by Messrs. J. Taylor & Co., who also have in hand the re-hanging of the bells at St. Mary Magdalene, Holloway.

Messrs. Gillett and Johnston have re-hung the bells at St. John the Baptist, Chipping Barnet, on ball-bearings, and are undertaking the complete re-casting of the peal of eight at St. James, Clerkenwell.

The Isleworth Bell Fund now reaches a total of £134, and an appeal is made for further support, as a considerable sum is needed before the augmentation is put in hand.

The Belfry Repairs Fund instituted in the S. & W. district early last year amounts to £2 4s. 6d.

We are glad to record an improvement in the health of our old friend, Mr. T. Beadle, after a long and serious illness. He received a great welcome at the Annual Meeting of the S. & W. district on February 9th of this year, which was the first meeting he had attended for two years. We trust he will be spared for many more.

The death of the esteemed Master of the S. & W. district, Mr. R. E. Holloway, which is referred to in our obituary notices, came with great suddenness. Always engaged in voluntary church work, he had just returned home after carrying out some of his duties when he died from hæmorrhage of the brain. His death caused a gap in the social life of the church in Acton.

To conclude, we again express our sincere thanks to those of our members who have done great service by way of instructing at several of our towers. Without this important work very little progress would be shown.

## IN MEMORIAM.

**Henry H. Chandler.** Died December 30th. He was a ringer at St. John's, Hillingdon, for some 30 years, and a member of the Association the whole of that time. He rang 64 Association peals, having conducted three of them.

**Charles I. Edwards.** Died June 26th. He was a member of the Heston band, and completed 50 years as a ringer in that tower at Christmas, 1927. His Association peals numbered 34, two of which he conducted. He rang his last peal on May 5th, only a few weeks before his death.

**William H. Freeman.** Died August 29th, aged 73 years. He joined the Association in 1899, but his membership was not continuous. He was a member of the Walthamstow (St. Mary's) band, and his peals for the Association were mostly rung at that Church, numbering 9 in all.

**William E. Garrard.** Died January 20th, aged 61 years. A member of the St. Mary Abbot's, Kensington, Society, and an ex-Master of the Ancient Society of College Youths. He was an able ringer and an accomplished conductor in all standard methods. He joined this Association in 1913, and rang in two peals with us.

**Robert E. Holloway.** Died October 3rd, at the early age of 48. He was Master of the S. & W. district since 1923, and a representative of the Central Council for the last five years. He was leader of the Acton band since 1912, and rang 23 peals with the Association.

**George Paice.** Died December 13th, aged 64 years. He was a member of the Edmonton band, and of the Association for some 26 years. A safe heavy bell-ringer in all standard methods, he rang in 40 Association peals, one of which he conducted. He was for many years tower keeper and local secretary at his home tower.

**Joseph P. Rayner.** Died May 8th, aged 92 years. He was steeplekeeper at St. Andrew's Holborn, for 50 years. He was well-known in London ringing circles, and a fairly regular attendant at our meetings. He joined the Association in 1906.

**Ernest H. Tubb.** Died early in November, aged 52 years. For 30 years he had been a ringer at Finchley, and was an original member of the Association. He was for many years secretary of the Finchley band. His Association peals numbered eight, mostly on six bells.
