Miss M L Todd listed for Sunbury being the first lady member of the Association with Ordinary Ringing Membership. MCALDG *Annual report* 1904-5.

Tall brick tower with cupola. Whitechapel cast 3 bells, tenor 10-2-0 in 1755. Bells appeared 1770, 1817 and 1851 to make six. 1901 to Loughborough and with added metal recast to 8, tenor 14-2-4 in F#, Steel H frame for 7 bells and the no. 3 in a low side frame above no. 4, *Ringling World* July 7<sup>th</sup> 1972 p. 534. **VP: Inscriptions on 7<sup>th</sup> and tenor if required.**

Brick tower, metal dome and cupola. 3 bells in 1755; single bells added 1770, 1817 and 1851, all Whitechapel. Dennis Brock *Ringling World* December 8<sup>th</sup> 1967 p. 896.

Monday August 11, 1913 in 2h 53m. 5040 Stedman Triples. Thurstans' four-part. A "William" peal: Lawrence, Hewett, Shepherd – conductor, New, Weatherstone, Fussell, Welling, Warne. MCALDG *Annual report* 1913.

Winchester & Oxford Guilds of Change Ringers. Saturday November 16, 1901 in 2h 43m. 5040 Stedman Triples. A variation of Thurstans' four-part. Charles Wiltshire, James Hunt, Charles Hazelden, John J Jones, Frank Blondell, Septimus Radford, Rev. Francis E Robinson – conductor, Thomas W Radford. This is the first peal on the recast and augmented bells. Peal board. Also *Bell news & ringers' record* November 2 1901 p. 356. Also:
