

## HAMPTON

The tower is at the west end of the church, which was built in 1831. The second floor small ringing room is accessed via a wooden staircase located in the north side. In this room there is one window in the west wall: the ceiling measures 20 feet high: one rope guide: a set of handbells size 20 in C

The belfry is located on the fourth (VP: Check because there appears to be a figure three on my copy of Steve's enquiry form) floor of the tower accessed via a ladder. The timber frame, installed in 1831, is an 'H' frame which occupies the whole space. All the bells which hang on one level have wooden headstocks and, from 1951, are on ball bearings.

The second bell is used as the service bell whilst the tenor is used as the hour clock bell.

The eight bells are rung in full circle.
